# Charles McMillan will update us on progress and status at the Okefenokee over the past year and may hit on other Coastal and regional hot issues.

Natural Resources Director at The Georgia Conservancy, Charles McMillan, a St Simons native, a Glynn Academy graduate (and just delightful human being) has enjoyed a fascinating career in ecology, and now has moved home - giving us a great environmental resource at our fingertips.

Charles is the Former President at AEC, Inc. Planning and Engineering, in Roswell, GA - a Planning, civil engineering and landscape architecture firm. He served two terms on the Board of the Ga Conservancy - the State's premiere Conservation and Ecology organization (founded by President Jimmy Carter btw). For those of you not familiar with TGC and what makes it 'stand out' - is that it has from the beginning served as a voice of reason - and is honestly the most trusted Conservation/Ecology organization in the State. It maintains a VERY strong presence at the Capital where legislators constantly seek out advice, information, and direction from TGC staff.

At just about the time Charles' board term was ending - - fate intervened when the critically important position of Coastal Resources Director overseeing all activities along the GA Coast from S.C. to Fl., unexpectedly fell vacant. TGC now has a wonderful new CRD in Courtney Reich, and Charles is now the (statewide) Natural Resources Director for TGC. This position allowed Charles and Cindy to move home to SSI permanently.

Charles LOVES the Coast. He adores Cumberland Island and knows it as<u>very</u>few do. Charles is thus also very intimately knowledgeable and involved with the Space-X activities in Camden County, and in recent years with the Mining 'wars' at the Okefenokee.
