History Moment: The Origins of Earth Day

"What would you have done if you saw your river burning? The Cuyahoga River that runs through the northeastern corner of Ohio was so polluted in the 1950s and 1960s that fish populations were decimated because of the river's oily, industry-produced pollution.
