INDIA TRIP - 2026



You are invited to join a fun-filled group tour of eastern India. In Feb 2026, Paul Mahata of Mt Airy Club (in coordination with the district) is organizing an India trip for interested Rotarians and Rotaractors and their guests. TRIP DETAILS:

- Visiting three Rotary global grant project sites in Purulia, India. These projects were supported by 23 Rotary clubs of district 7620.
- Attending the opening of a Rotary library, jointly operated by Purulia Rotary club and a local Trust.

Going on a special tour of eastern India which includes:

- Kolkata (Calcutta) and its impressive monuments (such as Victoria Memorial)
- Sundarbans Tiger Reserve (home of Royal Bengal Tigers), and
- Darjeeling tea gardens in the slopes of the Himalayan Range
- Other Options being considered: a) tour opportunities to other parts of India, and b) vaccinating children on Polio Vaccine Day

Expected cost for this fun-filled trip is \$2,500/person, including air fare. A similar group tour of India was organized in 2020, and it was a grand success. Five Rotarians had joined in to visit northern India's "Golden Triangle". Commitment window to make the India trip-2026 closes by May 16, 2025.

Map of Schools – All the DC Public Schools have been pinned on Google Maps. You may access this map on [Sign Up Genius](#). This is used as a visual tool to see where schools are in relation to one another or to your residence/ work.

Bookmarks – Please do not forget to take bookmarks to handout with the dictionaries. The bookmarks have been placed in brown paper bags in increments of 20. Each bag is labeled with a "20" on the outside of it. These bookmarks are a great way to explain the many ways the dictionaries can be used, and they get the word out about our club. And, of course, students can use them to mark their places in the dictionary.



The 2026-27 Rotary Peace Fellowship application is available online through 15 May 2025 at this link:

A club or district recommendation is optional, but strongly encouraged as part of the application of a candidate.

Submitted applications are screened for eligibility requirements. Qualified applications move forward for further review and evaluation. The Rotary Peace Centers Committee, composed of Rotary members, and university representatives review the top candidates and select finalists. Top candidates may be contacted by the university for an interview. Selected candidates are notified in November.

Throughout the process, applications are reviewed based on the following criteria:

Qualification based on the eligibility requirements

English proficiency

Commitment to peace and development

Leadership potential

Compatibility with fellowship objectives and fit with Rotary Academic record and compatibility with preferred university program

Feasibility and impact of Social Change Initiative (certificate only)

Rotary Peace Fellowships may not be used for doctoral study.

The following people are not eligible for the fellowship: Active Rotary members, or Rotaract members who are also Rotary members* Employees of a Rotary club or district, Rotary International, or other Rotary entity Spouses, lineal descendants (children or grandchildren by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parents or grandparents by blood) of any living person in these categories Former Rotary members and their relatives as described above (within 36 months of their resignation) * Rotaract club members who are not also Rotary club members are eligible to apply.

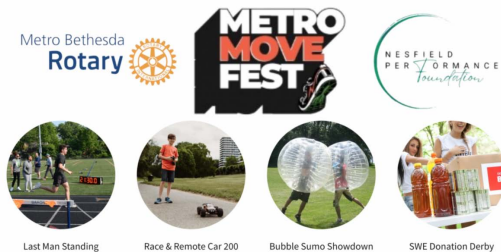
