## Rotarians Speaking at Carter School Spring 2025 Peace Week April 14-18

Rotary International President Stephanie Urchick, Al Jubitz, cofounder of the Rotary Action Group for Peace, Ozuem Esiri Founder of the Rotary Districts and Clubs Joint International Mega-Meeting Platform, Arthur Kanegis Rotarian, Filmmaker and Podcast host, Arthur Romano, former Rotary Peace Fellow, Nawal Rajeh and Mari Clark, Melvin Hardy members of District 7620 Rotary Club of Washington Global (a peace-builder club), will be speaking at the Carter School for Peace and Conflict Resolution, George Mason University Spring 2025 Peace week.

Their sessions will include discussion of pilot activities of the Rotary-Carter Collaboration for Peace aiming to diminish urban violence and achieve a final peace agreement in Cyprus, as well as remembrance of Rotarian David Fishman, whose vision inspired this collaboration. Rotary Peace Fellow, Diego Carneiro, will present a session on music and peacemaking – using music as a tool for conflict resolution and emotional healing. Virtual and in-person Peace Week sessions will focus on the challenges to peace and stability posed by persistent conflicts in regions such as Europe, South Asia, and the Middle East, the escalating impacts of climate change, and the rise of artificial intelligence.

Panels and workshops will address the need to rethink the concept of peace and how peace can be achieved and sustained. These are themes that were featured in the recent Rotary International President's Peace Conference in Istanbul. Peace week sessions will present innovative strategies, effective practices, and cutting-edge innovations in the field of conflict resolution. In addition to the pilot activities of the Rotary-Carter Collaboration for Peace will be featured.

**Assignment list** – Use [Sign Up Genius](#) to sign up for the school of your choice based on availability. Please pick (preferably) two schools. There are two slots available per school. Click the light blue "sign up" button to sign up for a school. School sign-ups are on a first come, first serve basis.

**Delivery Instructions** – The delivery instructions are available on the Club's [Sign Up Genius](#) site.

**Map of Schools** – All the DC Public Schools have been pinned on Google Maps. You may access this map on [Sign Up Genius](#). This is used as a visual tool to see where schools are in relation to one another or to your residence/ work.

**Bookmarks** – Please do not forget to take bookmarks to handout with the dictionaries. The bookmarks have been placed in brown paper bags in increments of 20. Each bag is labeled with a "20" on the outside of it. These bookmarks are a great way to explain the many ways the dictionaries can be used, and they get the word out about our club. And, of course, students can use them to mark their places in the dictionary.

**List of Schools** – The list of schools is available on the [Sign Up Genius](#) site. The list was recently updated and includes the school's address and phone number.

**Partnering Up** – We recommend you partner with a friend, a family member, or another Rotary member to share the experience and make it more fun!

**Storage Unit** – We have a new storage unit. The storage facility is still located at Cube Smart (175 R St. NE) but our new unit is now on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. The storage unit details are listed in the delivery instructions document.

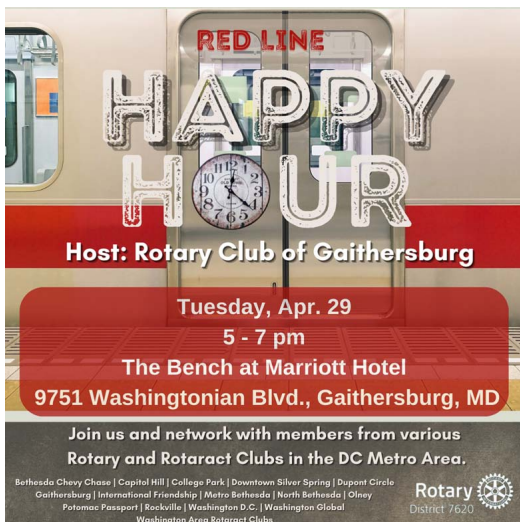

A club or district recommendation is optional, but strongly encouraged as part of the application of a candidate.

Submitted applications are screened for eligibility requirements. Qualified applications move forward for further review and evaluation. The Rotary Peace Centers Committee, composed of Rotary members, and university representatives review the top candidates and select finalists. Top candidates may be contacted by the university for an interview. Selected candidates are notified in November.

Throughout the process, applications are reviewed based on the following criteria:

Qualification based on the eligibility requirements

English proficiency

Commitment to peace and development

Leadership potential

Compatibility with fellowship objectives and fit with Rotary Academic record and compatibility with preferred university program

Feasibility and impact of Social Change Initiative (certificate only)

Rotary Peace Fellowships may not be used for doctoral study.

The following people are not eligible for the fellowship: Active Rotary members, or Rotaract members who are also Rotary members\* Employees of a Rotary club or district, Rotary International, or other Rotary entity Spouses, lineal descendants (children or grandchildren by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parents or grandparents by blood) of any living person in these categories Former Rotary members and their relatives as described above (within 36 months of their resignation) \* Rotaract club members who are not also Rotary club members are eligible to apply.
