Message from our Chair Jerry Gortner

Following a very memorable trip to the Rotary International Convention in Melbourne, Australia we are planning our annual meeting on August 18-19 in Albany, New York. Because we received very positive feedback on breakout sessions at our 2022 annual meeting, we will have 9 breakout sessions this year with the first three starting at 1:15 on Friday, August 18th. Breakouts will be focusing on the areas where we received the most questions in 2022-23.

In this newsletter there is a listing of the breakouts planned for our annual meeting, so you can start planning to attend the ones that will be most beneficial to you. Our Governors and Assistant Governors, as well as our facilitators, are a very important part of making the Rotary Leadership Institute sessions successful. One breakout will focus on registration, which will be beneficial for site chairs, Governors, and Assistant Governors. Our Administrative Assistant Donna Rinaldi and Lin Kelly with DACdb will be facilitating this session and a session on the use of DACdb reports. We are suggesting that everyone attending either of these sessions have their laptops to walk through the registration process and to utilize the reports.



We are organizing the breakouts to not only benefit our facilitators and site chairs, but also to benefit Governors and Assistant Governors. Site chairs and Regional Vice Chairs (RVC) will have multiple breakouts running simultaneously to attend; we will ask them to designate another Rotarian to attend the simultaneous session so they can receive the benefits from each.

Our RI Zone Director Drew Kessler will be speaking live to us from Vancouver, British Columbia via Zoom; he is interested in having you ask questions at that time for his response.

We will continue to stay within our constitutionally required 150-mile radius of New York City and if you like our location in Albany, we will find a location in a different direction from New York City for our 2024 annual meeting.

We approved several items at our winter board meeting that will be presented at our business meeting on Saturday, August 19. These items involve expenses for facilitators at our sessions as well as expense reimbursements for our annual meeting. Each of our 22 Districts has one vote and the voting delegate is the site chair, unless delegated to another district member.

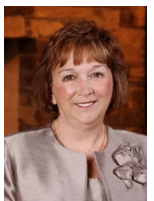
Looking forward to seeing you at the Wolfe Road Marriott in Albany on August 18 and 19!

In- Person Session Fee = \$75 - \$125 depending on the site

(Rotaracts = \$50)

Virtual Session Time Commitment = 9:00 am – 2:00 pm

(breaks provided throughout)

Or

2 evenings within an 8 day block = 6:00 pm – 9:00 pm

In-Person Session Time Commitment = 8:30 am – 3:00 pm

(breaks provided throughout / breakfast & lunch provided)
