Message from Chair Gerald Gortner



I hope everyone had a very Happy Thanksgiving! We were able to celebrate Thanksgiving with our daughter and family in Massachusetts. Celebrating Thanksgiving in Massachusetts is always very special to me.

This fall, all our Rotary Leadership Institute sessions were in-person, with one in Vermont, a first in five years. In mid-November, we sent a request to all facilitators who did not facilitate fall sessions requesting which sites they would prefer to facilitate this winter and spring. If you are a facilitator and have not responded, please do so to our Executive Director Deb Glisson by December 15. This will allow our Regional Vice Chairs to plan their sites with facilitators for our upcoming Winter and Spring sessions.

This winter we are piloting one session on a Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. To complete the part you are taking, you will need to attend both Zoom sessions. This is a pilot, and we will determine at our next annual meeting if we will continue to offer evening zoom sessions. With the success of our zoom sessions last year, we will be offering at least one additional zoom session in the Spring.

At our mid-year executive committee meeting in January, we will be discussing and planning our 2023-24 sessions. Please talk with your site chairs and District Governor Elect to set your dates and sites for 2023-24. We are looking forward to increasing our number of sites to at least 20 in the year ahead with two faculty training sessions in 2023-24.

Facilitators, please remember to respond to our mid-November letter as we are waiving the facilitation requirement of facilitating at least once every two years for the remainder of this 2022-23 year due to our restrictions by COVID. For the 2023-24 year, facilitators will need to have facilitated during the past two years or attend the refresher session at our annual RLI meeting in August.

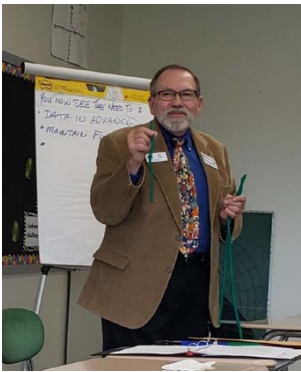

Some tips on how to market your RLI sessions

As a former District Site Chair, Regional Vice Chair, and current RLI NEA Secretary, I decided to be proactive, for our last RLI session in New England, to temporarily assume the roles of District Site Chair and RVC, to find a new site, to find a new District Site Chair, and to use 2022 to train her for the following year.

RLI has a process with detailed instructions for all roles and responsibilities that are well defined on the RLINEA website. These are available to all, and the process works. Following these guidelines will guarantee a successful session. So, you see, there is nothing to write about.

But in addition to the posted instructions and training, I would suggest:

Start to promote early, throughout the year, and at all district functions

- Include dates for all sessions, not only for your own district

- Try to have an RLI page on the district web site. Unfortunately, this will depend on the current District Governor.
- Send a minimum of three notices to all Rotarians in the district starting at least 6 weeks prior to the event
- Promotion is everyone's responsibility, especially faculty: if you want to facilitate, you need to promote. (Included in faculty training, with constant reminders to all facilitators)
- Encourage all Rotarians to take sessions out of their district: "You don't need to wait 3 years to graduate" plus there are additional benefits to going out of district.
