## Who We Are

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative is a public-private partnership led by national governments with six partners – the World Health Organization (WHO), Rotary International, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), Gates Foundation and Gavi, the vaccine alliance. Its goal is to eradicate polio worldwide.

### Rotary International's role as one of the 6 Partners:

Rotary International is the world's first and largest humanitarian service organization with a global network of 1.2 million members in more than 170 countries. Through its PolioPlus program, established in 1985, Rotary was the first to have the vision of a polio-free world.

Rotary's primary responsibilities include fundraising, advocacy, and volunteer recruitment. More than one million Rotary members have volunteered their time and personal resources to polio eradication. Rotary members also provide valuable field support during National Immunization Days through social mobilization and by administering the oral polio vaccine to children.

Rotary is the **main private sector donor to polio eradication** as Rotary members have contributed more than **\$2.7 billion dollars and countless volunteer hours** to the fight to end polio. In November 2007, Rotary International entered into a unique partnership with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

## Candidate Forum brings Rotary and Chamber members together

The room was full and lively at last week's joint meeting of Susitna Rotary Club and the Greater Wasilla Area Chamber of Commerce. David Wilson and Stephen Wright, two of the Senate candidates for District N, started off the evening with 1 minute introductions, 1 minute responses to questions and a 1 minute wrap-up. We then heard platform





statements from two incumbent candidates (Cathy Tilton and Delena Johnson) who are running unopposed, and their response to the question, "How do you feel you've made a difference as a legislator?"



Then it got lively as the seven candidates that were present that are facing opposition (David Eastman, Doyle Holmes, Kevin McCabe, Steve Menard, Jessica Wright, and Stephen Wright) were invited to have a seat at the center stage for an opportunity to provide a 1-minute introduction followed by a series of questions with a final wrap-up statement.

The forum was moderated by Marty Metiva and Jackie Kenshalo, who both did a fine job of keeping the event moving along and giving each candidate the opportunity to present their positions/answers in a nonpartisan setting.

*"Help us train adults and young leaders to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, and illiteracy."*

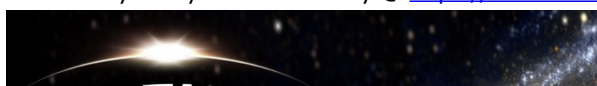
