## Grant for Baja Cervical Cancer Equipment

In support of the new Loreto Magico Rotary Club sponsored by Susitna Rotary in Loreto, BSC, Mexico, the Susitna board of directors approved a \$1,000 matching grant donation for the Baja HPV DNA PCR Screening Rotary Global Grant to eliminate cervical cancer.

#### **Project Overview:**

Cervical cancer is the fourth most common cancer in women globally with an estimated 604 000 new cases and 342 000 deaths in 2020. The highest rates of cervical cancer incidence and mortality are in low- and middleincome countries. This reflects major inequities driven by lack of access to national HPV vaccination, cervical screening and treatment services, and social and economic determinants. Cervical cancer is caused by persistent infection with the human papillomavirus (HPV). Screening and treatment of HPV pre-cancerous lesions are highly effective ways to prevent cervical cancer; these approaches are very cost-effective. Cervical cancer can be prevented and/or cured if diagnosed at an early stage and treated promptly.

Our main objectives are 1) to enhance/upgrade the infrastructure of the cooperating medical organizations, and 2) to improve the capacity of the health care professionals. These objectives will be met by donating DNA HPV PCR Screening state-of-the-art equipment, as recommended by WHO (World Health Organization), as well as a treatment tool that is highly effective, less painful, and easy to learn and use, as well as training for these medical providers.

The beneficiaries of this project will be the medical professionals whose skills will be enhanced by use of the DNA machine and treatment tool, and consequently the population of women in Baja, many of whom have poor access to health care and who are economically disadvantaged, plus the family members of those women, as well as society at large, residing in Baja, Mexico, which falls in RI D4100.

## August: Membership and New Club Development Month

### How to propose a new member

August is Membership Month!

One of the privileges - and responsibilities - of being a Rotarian is to introduce others to Rotary. This could be as simple as bringing them to a club meeting, inviting them to a Rotary event, or encouraging participation in a service project. Once the person has gotten to know more about the organization, if you feel they would be a good fit with Susitna Rotary Club and they are interested in joining Rotary, the club's ByLaws delineate the process:



## **Article 10 Electing Members of the Club**

Section 1 â $\in$ " Proposed Membership: A member shall propose a person for membership to the Board. A transferring or former member of another club may be proposed for membership by the losing or most recent former club.

Section 2 â€" Confidential Phase: The proposal is kept confidential until the Board ensures the candidate meets Rotary's membership requirements.

**Section 3**  $\hat{a} \in "$  **Board Action**: The Board shall approve or reject the candidate  $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{M}$ s membership within 30 days and shall notify the proposer of the decision.

Section 4 â€" Invitation to Apply: If the decision of the Board is favorable, the prospective member is invited to join the club, educated about Rotary and membership requirements, and asked to sign the membership proposal form.

Section 5 â€" Announcement of Proposed Member: The president, or other member designated by the president, announces the name and proposed classification of the proposed member to the club.

**Section 6. Presumed Election**: If no member of the club submits a written objection, including reasons for the objection, to a director within seven calendar days after the club is notified of the prospective member, the proposed member, upon payment of required fees / dues, is considered to be elected to membership.

Section 7. Objection to Membership: If a written objection has been filed with a director, the club shall vote on the matter at its next meeting. This vote may be postponed to a later meeting by decision of the membership. If approved by the club, the proposed member is elected to membership after admission fee payment. If not approved by the club, the president, or other member designated by the president, shall inform the proposed member of the clubâ€<sup>™</sup>s decision. Such rejected members may be reconsidered after a minimum of twelve months.

**Section 8 â€" Honorary Members**: The club may elect honorary members proposed by the Board.

Section 9 â€" Corporate Members: The club may admit corporate members as provided in Article 12.
