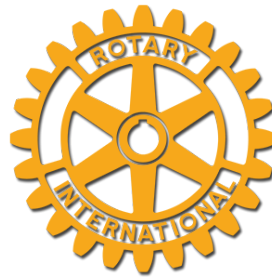

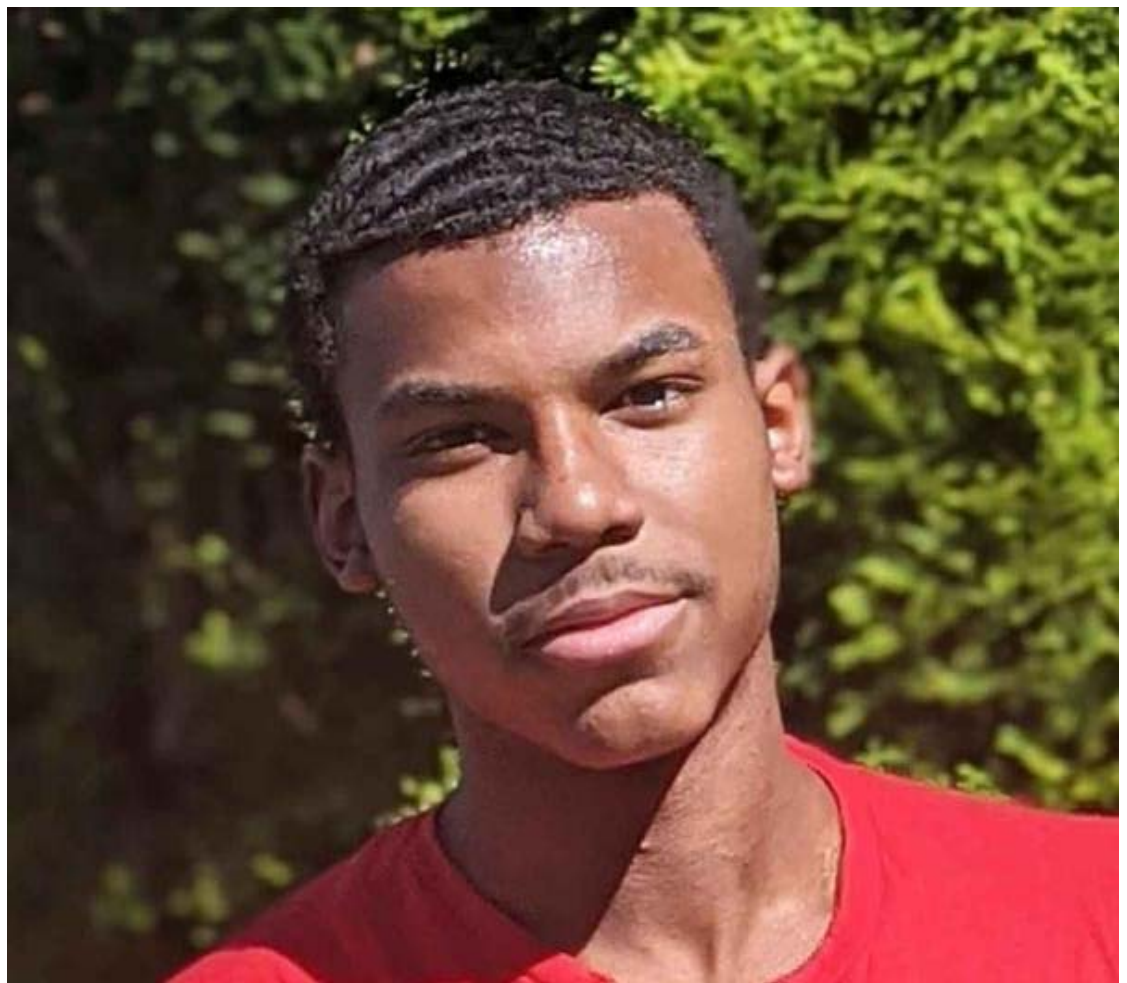

Kahlomo Cunningham has been named the Aberdeen Rotary February Student of the Month. The son of Tanikka Watford, he has earned a GPA of 3.79. He has applied and been accepted to 58 colleges. He will be attending his first choice, Gonzaga University, to study Engineering Management and Environmental Engineering.

Kahloma describes his community service, "In the midst of Covid when people struggle to get essential items, I volunteered to get the resources to the people who were struggling the most. This was through volunteering to distribute items like food, PPE, hygiene supplies, and school supplies to families, and people personally through a community distribution. And I was also able to assign companies to specific times to pick up for organizations to further help people in need. Through this, I was able to not only impact people in the different counties in Washington, but I was also able to help people in different states like Alabama, California, and Canada. "

"I have shown leadership in my passion and interest in improving and bettering the community by working with the Washington State Department of Commerce to advocate for the needs of youth within my community as well as in other communities struggling with homeless and abuse."

As a sophomore, Kahloma earned the Technology Student Association (TSA) Nationals Competition Award, and was Certified Logistics Supply Chain Instructor/Teacher and the Logistics Technician Instructor Certificate. As a junior he was awarded the Black Scholars program Certificate of Achievement and received the Academic Achievement Invitation of Scholars National Youth Leadership Forum: Engineering (By World Strive) in both junior and senior years.
