PROGRAM



Bremerton Police Chief **Tom Wolfe** was our featured speaker. He told us that we have an amazing Police Department that has delivered a couple of decades of amazing work. He said the core group BPD is hiring now are working hard; theyâ€™re in the profession for all the right reasons. BPD has had some difficulty hiring new people, especially since some of the larger police departments in the area can offer higher salaries. They are currently down four positions, but have 10 persons who just got out of the Police Academy and are in field training process.

He said city is lacking a strong mental health component. There aren't enough beds for mental health and drug abuse patients. He has dealt with influxes of various kinds of illegal drugs over the years, but the current crisis with fentanyl is the worst he has ever seen. In the last two weeks, police officers brought back half a dozen people who were experiencing overdoses using Narcan.

Chief Wolfe said he completely disagrees with moves to make possession of drugs a misdemeanor in this state. He said we have to have an accountability piece along with compassion.
