The program on Bremerton High Schoolâ€[™]s longstanding Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps was introduced by **Chief Brian Newvine**, a Naval Sciences instructor in the program. Students who complete all four years of NJROTC are eligible to eligible join any branch of the military at a higher pay grade. There are currently about 109 students in the unit. About 60 percent of the cadets go on to higher education.

Then he turned it over to two students, **Cadet Lt. Cmdr. Andrea Brown**, the new Commanding Officer of the unit, and **Cadet Cmdr. Monroe Shoup**, the previous C.O. The NJROTC unit participates in many local events, including retirement ceremonies for military personnel, West Hills Elementaryâ€[™]s STEM night and Veterans Day assemblies at the middle and elementary schools. They provide a color guard for various events, including our own Bremerton Rotary Blackberry Festival.
