Dear Dan:

Please receive a huge thanks to you and to Gig Harbor Midday Rotary Club for participating in the October 22-31 Warm Coat Drive planned by Advocates for Immigrants in Detention Northwest (AIDNW), a Tacoma-based nonprofit. Because of your Rotary club's enthusiastic efforts to motivate and collect winter coats in the Gig Harbor+ area, 48 asylum seekers (to date) have or will be receiving warm coats from your club as they are released from the Northwest ICE Processing Center in Tacoma. Not only were they of good quality, but some were new, still in the packages. And the cash donation was also appreciated!

These coats are just in time, too, because by November 2 the temperatures had dropped into the forties and the AIDNW volunteers who greet the released immigrants at the RV Welcome Center were down to zero coats there. Thanks to you and Gig Harbor midday Rotary, our "Help Northwest Immigrants Feel the Warmth This Winter" coat campaign was quite a success!

In January, the number of asylum-seekers who arrive at our US borders as "would be" refugees will likely increase. This is because Title 42, applied during Covid will be halted. So, those immigrants who could not wait for the US Refugee/ USCIS system to process them due to current complicated paperwork and huge refugee backlogs, will arrive under their right to seek asylum. In January, they will not be sent back to squalid Mexican border camps to await their immigration hearings. but will be released to family or sponsors in the US from ICE processing facilities, such as the one in Tacona. During this coat drive, AIDNW collected a total of 336 coats, including from some Starbucks store sponsorships and several churches. So, we hope that will last through the expected increased numbers during the coldest months.

Again, thanks so much for supporting asylum seeking immigrants in our PNW area! The enthusiasm and care for others less fortunate shown by Gig Harbor Midday Rotary is awesome and much appreciated!


