Program: Olympia Policy Department – Rich Allen, Chief of Police

Past President Al Cohen, introduced Rich Allen. Rich has been with the Olympia Policy Department for many years. He was recently appointed to serve as the permanent Chief of Policy after serving as the Interim Chief of Policy. Chief Allen has worked in law enforcement for 31 years, beginning when he was 15 and started volunteering as an Olympia Police Explorer. A native of Olympia, he is a proud graduate of Olympia High School. He is also a graduate of the FBI national academy.

Chief Allen gave a presentation about the Olympia Police Department, the different divisions, the structure, changes for the 2023 year and long-range goals for the department. The two departments are Outreach & Administration and Operations. In Outreach & Administration the following are included: Outreach Services (Critical Response Unit/Familiar Faces), Support Services (records and evidence), Community Policing (walking patrol, neighborhood policing unit, special operations), Business Systems & Planning. Within the Operations department are: Field Operations (Patrol/911 response), Investigation Services (Detectives, recruitment/training), Corrections. OPD has a Professional Standards Lieutenant who reports directly to the Chief. The department has 125 employees, 78 are certified officers. OPD handles about 60,000 calls per year. Annual budget (when fully funded) is about \$25 million. One week from today, all OPD officers will be wearing body cameras. The department is committed to transparency.

The City of Olympia has a municipal jail that functions as a short-term holding facility. Built in 1966 it has 28 beds and 14 employees. The average daily population is 18 days. The average length of stay is 5 days. A short-term facility does not have an outdoor recreation area. If someone is ordered to serve longer than 30 days in the Olympia jail, they will be sent to a larger local jail with recreation facilities. Top five crimes: assault, assault domestic violence, theft, criminal trespass, DUI. The jail offers contracted on-site medical/mental health services, family visitation, AA/NA meetings, religious services, Narcan distribution program (dug cessation).

The department also has a Police Auditor. This is a contract position through the City of Olympia. The focus areas: Independent Review and Audit of: use of force, complaints, internal investigations; Review and Recommend Revisions: policies, procedures, training. All auditor findings are presented to the full Olympia Council twice each year.
