Memorial Day 2025 at Silverdale Veterans Memorial Park

Memorial Day morning was quiet and beautiful as we arrived at Silverdale Waterfront Park to prepare the Veteran's Memorial area for the annual ceremony to salute our fallen. Brianna Angelo and I were coached by Past President and longtime ceremony coordinator Rich Arper to lower the service flags to half staff at sunrise, exactly 5:20 a.m.



The ascending sun sparkled off the light rain as the flags blew almost stiff against the wind. We kept our comments quiet and sparse to give due respect to the time-honored tradition.

Surveying the park, we noted that Kitsap County personnel had kept the area well maintained. We tidied up by blowing leaves off of the pathways and seating area, wiping down tables and handrails, and emptying some trash bins. Rich taped off the gazebo with a sign promoting the ceremony that would be held later in the morning. After pausing to experience the serenity of the scene and take a few photos, we left to rest before returning just after 11:00 a.m. to greet fellow Rotarians, event speakers, and public attendees. Rich was first to return, setting up the wreath of fresh flowers on a tripod stand, a portable sound system, and a container of carnations for attendees to lay at the foot of the service flags at the conclusion of the ceremony.



I am always pleased by the people who attend this event. This year's showing was possibly the best ever. All of the bench seats facing the water were occupied, as were the folding chairs, and many of us were standing at the rail overlooking the map of the world that is portrayed through flat stones and a finely manicured lawn.

Rich spoke to the history of the Veteran's Memorial area, thanked those who had helped with preparations, acknowledged Diane Shropshire from VFW Post 4992 Silverdale who keeps the flags in good repair, and introduced George Bakke, also from VFW Post 4992 Silverdale, who delivered a thoughtful speech regarding the history of Memorial Day (first known as Decoration Day) and called out the fact that we had several children in attendance who were getting an important lesson in the price that had been paid for our freedom. Local trumpeter, Steve Pargman, perfectly played Taps as we all let the emotion of the moment sink in.



Rich invited attendees to take positions at the service flags and raise them to full staff after he had raised the US flag. We were then able to place one of the carnations at the foot of a service flag in commemoration of veterans that we had known who had lost their lives in service. The aftermath was a time to socialize with friends old and new, promote the amazing organization that is Rotary, and admire the patriotic flowers and the flags waving against the bright blue sky.
