Error Message on Service Selfies in Ignite App. If you get an error message trying to upload a photo you took with your phone, it may be your phone settings. You need to allow permission to access the camera or photos when the question pops up. Go to Settings - Privacy and Security and check both Photos and Camera. Under Photos, you may see that Ignite has been given no access (may say "Private access"). If you select "Limited Access" it will ask you to select a handful of photos that Ignite can access. Those will be the only photos it can ever access. If you select "Full Access," then you should be able to add any photo at any time. Also check the Camera setting the same Privacy and Security menu, and if that is toggled off then toggling it on would allow the app to access the camera.

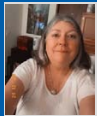

Tips for Recruiting Duck Race Sponsors

At Rotary on March 6, Cathy and Christie shared tips for recruiting sponsors, both previous and prospective. **Deadline for sponsorships is March 31.** We are trying hard to NOT extend the deadline – the sooner we have all the information, the sooner we can design and print the tickets and get them into YOUR hands to sell ducks!

- Put on a smile and remind yourself of what a great event this is and all the good we do because of it! Let your passion for Rotary shine through while you describe what we do with the funds we raise.
- Be ready to answer the question, “what is Rotary?” Develop your elevator speech.
- If you are a sponsor, you can say, “please join me in sponsoring our Duck Race to raise funds for the community.”
- Use the [2024 Ticket Back](#) – it’s all there!
 - Shows the list of sponsors and the prizes – great publicity for your company.
 - Shows the partial list of recipients of the proceeds – great things we have done.
 - Prizes – thousands of people buy tickets and see the information on the back.
- Use the [2024 Ticket Front](#) to show the advantage of the donation of a \$1,000 prize.
- Remember that all sponsorships, to make it onto the ticket, must be at least \$100.
- Use the [Quacker Backer](#) to go through the perks that come with sponsorships – it’s contained in the [Sponsor Letter and Package](#). Hard copies of the package are also available at Rotary.
- Remember to point out and/or fill out the center of the [Pledge Sheet](#) using the [Quacker Backer](#).

Important Note from President Glen on District 5020 Conference

I recently received a letter from our District 5020 Governor, Bill McGregor, appealing for our help. As you know, District 5020 straddles the US/Canada border. A growing number of Vancouver Island Rotarians have indicated they will not be attending this year's Conference in Tacoma on May 30-31. The two main reasons are the current exchange rate and resentment over President Trump imposing tariffs on Canada.

This has the potential to create a serious shortfall in attendance at the Conference. District 5020 has already committed to a minimum number of hotel nights, meal guarantees, and other fixed costs. Failure to meet these commitments will have significant financial implications for the District.

There is a way to address this pending problem – DG Bill is asking our Washington-based District 5020 members to help fill the gap by making a special effort to register and attend the Conference. He requests that our American members act now to register for the Conference and stay a minimum of one night at the Downtown Marriott in Tacoma.

This Conference features a roster of inspiring and accomplished speakers with incredible stories and experiences. In addition, the Conference will offer a variety of learning sessions tailored to meet the expressed needs of our District's clubs. This conference will be a vibrant mix of learning, camaraderie, and fun.

If you are a Silverdale Rotarian who will be serving on next year's board, or a new member in the club for fewer than 12 months, the club will reimburse you for your registration and room charges! Members are encouraged to register early. Conference registration and hotel reservations can be made at www.conference.rotary5020.org.

On March 6, President Elect Dale Robinson spoke to us about membership, "one of the most important committees in our Club." This helps you to think critically about who you would like to see a part of your club. Update about Steve Burton

Written on March 5: I had to take Steve to the ER almost two weeks ago for what turned out to be a kidney stone. In the imaging for the kidney stone, they also found a mass in Steve's bladder. He had surgery a week ago to remove as much of the mass as they could. The size of the mass prevented removing it in its entirety during one surgery.

We got the pathology report yesterday afternoon. It is cancer. The next step will be for them to go in again on March 25 and see if they are able to remove the rest of the mass completely. They have to wait a little while for the bladder to heal from the last surgery. The outcome of that next surgery will determine the next steps.

We are optimistic. We are thinking that the kidney stone that took us to the ER a couple of weeks ago may have saved his life. This

situation will require that his second knee replacement be placed on hold for the foreseeable future. We would love some prayers or good thoughts, whatever may be your practice.

The Washington State Science & Engineering Fair (WSSEF) <https://wssef.org/> happens every year in Bremerton, with students from all over the state coming to be judged for their efforts. This year's WSSEF is on March 28th and 29th, and they have only half the judges needed. Advanced degrees or experience are NOT required for lower and middle grades, and the more of those we get, the easier it will be for everyone. This is a wonderful opportunity for service, and you can expect an amazing personal experience as well. My first year as a judge, I met a 3rd grader who coded and trained a neural net to recognize recyclable garbage, and I met high schoolers who were working on everything from school shootings to water reclamation.

PSE Energy Efficiency Programs

With the recent major power outage due to severe storms that hit parts of our county, the timing of this presenter could not have been better. **On March 6, we had a wonderful presentation from Zachary Kaija of PSE**, outlining several important topics like their *Flex* program, rebates and ways to save, and how they're showing up in our community.

PSE is committed to helping customers unlock rewards for adjusting their energy usage. They have three programs to assist with this - Flex Rewards, Flex Smart, and Flex EV - details at <http://pse.com/flex>. Every program has an offering just for enrolling ranging from \$25-\$50. These Flex events are what they call periods of time when their experts predict heightened demand for electricity based on a range of different criteria, typically lasting between 2-4 hours between 7AM and 10PM where you can earn additional rewards for lowering and being more cognizant of your energy usage.

PSE has also helped us find a number of rebates on household items when you upgrade to more energy efficient ones. Right now, you could get \$1,500-\$2,400 for upgrading to a heat pump system, \$750-\$850 for upgrading to a heat pump water heater and more, depending on model and other factors. They have [assistance programs](#) for qualified customers.

Lastly, with the recent outages, PSE set up at different central locations to meet with customers, hand out snacks and water, and give updates on restoration efforts. Engaging with the community is such a big part of what they do, and they love when they see others doing the same.

On February 10, Rotary International President-Elect Mário César Martins de Camargo asked members to *Unite for Good* by embracing growth, service, and connection as he outlined a plan to expand "the best-qualified team of volunteers on the planet."

"Rotary's greatest asset is not our history, our projects, or even our unmatched global reach. It is our members," de Camargo said at the organization's International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 10 February. He noted praise from one of Rotary's partners about "the extraordinary dedication" of Rotary members. "That recognition from an outsider deepened my understanding: Rotary's greatest gift to the world is its people."

De Camargo, a member of the Rotary Club of Santo André, São Paulo, Brazil, **emphasized the importance of seeking out new perspectives and strengthening Rotary's service to communities around the globe.** He outlined three "essential pillars" for growth: innovation, continuity, and partnership.
