

International Business as Mission - Program on March 13

On March 13 we heard an astonishing presentation from Jeff Samuelson about a nonprofit, International Business as Mission, that teaches budding entrepreneurs in the poorest of countries (e.g., Kazakhstan, Morocco, Syria, Indonesia, North Korea) how to start a successful business, and provides microloans that they pay back. The goal: 1 million new businesses in 15 years with a "hand up, not a handout." IBAM is funded entirely by donations, and its bedrock values emphasize honesty and integrity.



Jeff described classes where the students get certificates for completing the training including creating a business plan, budgeting, and finance. He gave examples of small businesses that have been successfully created: raising French bulldog puppies and finches for sale, fruit and vegetable gardens, egg incubations, breeding livestock, and gardens raising cut flowers.



Jeff would like to do a pilot in the U.S. – Kitsap County - but needs funding (\$5,000 per student) and advisors. See below for contact information.



Important Note from President Glen on District 5020 Conference

I recently received a letter from our District 5020 Governor, Bill McGregor, appealing for our help. As you know, District 5020 straddles the US/Canada border. A growing number of Vancouver Island Rotarians have indicated they will not be attending this year's Conference in Tacoma on May 30-31. The two main reasons are the current exchange rate and resentment over President Trump imposing tariffs on Canada.

This has the potential to create a serious shortfall in attendance at the Conference. District 5020 has already committed to a minimum number of hotel nights, meal guarantees, and other fixed costs. Failure to meet these commitments will have significant financial implications for the District.

There is a way to address this pending problem – DG Bill is asking our Washington-based District 5020 members to help fill the gap by making a special effort to register and attend the Conference. He requests that our American members act now to register for the Conference and stay a minimum of one night at the Downtown Marriott in Tacoma.

This Conference features a roster of inspiring and accomplished speakers with incredible stories and experiences. In addition, the Conference will offer a variety of learning sessions tailored to meet the expressed needs of our District's clubs. This conference will be a vibrant mix of learning, camaraderie, and fun.

If you are a Silverdale Rotarian who will be serving on next year's board, or a new member in the club for fewer than 12 months, the club will reimburse you for your registration and room charges! Members are encouraged to register early. Conference registration and hotel reservations can be made at <u>www.conference.rotary5020.org</u>.

After reading DB Bill's letter, I sent him the following reply:

I recently saw a Paul Harris quote that may apply in this situation: "It has been the way of Rotary to focus thought upon matters in which members are in agreement, rather than upon matters in which they are in disagreement." I understand the frustration and distress of our friends north of the border; here's hoping that the shifting political tides that would pull us apart will prove no match for the powerful ideals that bind us together as Rotarians.

Update - Judges Needed for Science and Engineering Fair

The Washington State Science & Engineering Fair (WSSEF) <u>https://wssef.org/</u> happens every year in Bremerton, with students from all over the state coming to be judged for their efforts. <u>WSSEF Video</u>. This will be my second year as a judge, and it's an amazing experience that has fueled so much of my hope for the future. For more about judging, see <u>Judging Info</u>

This year's WSSEF is on March 28th and 29th, and they have only half the judges needed. Advanced degrees or experience are NOT required for lower and middle grades, and the more of those we get, the easier it will be for everyone. This is a wonderful opportunity for service, and you can expect an amazing personal experience as well. My first year as a judge, I met a 3rd grader who coded and trained a neural net to recognize recyclable garbage, and I met high schoolers who were working on everything from school shootings to water reclamation.

Please consider filling out the <u>STEM Wizard - Judge Registration Form</u> and seeing what grades you qualify for. You will be provided training. These kids need us. They have such passion, such ingenuity, and such generosity, I know they will inspire you as much as they do me. One day as a judge will give you Thought for the Day material for months! If you are not available on those dates, please consider sharing this message and the above link with anyone you know of who has an interest in science, children and/or our community. If we can just get a few new judges this year, we are confident that we will see them again for years to come.

PSE Energy Efficiency Programs

With the recent major power outage due to severe storms that hit parts of our county, the timing of this presenter could not have been better. **On March 6, we had a wonderful presentation from Zachary Kaija of PSE,** outlining several important topics like their *Flex* program, rebates and ways to save, and how they're showing up in our community.

PSE is committed to helping customers unlock rewards for adjusting their energy usage. They have three programs to assist with this - Flex Rewards, Flex Smart, and Flex EV - details at http://pse.com/flex. Every program has an offering just for enrolling ranging from \$25-\$50. These Flex events are what they call periods of time when their experts predict heightened demand for electricity based on a range of different criteria, typically lasting between 2-4 hours between 7AM and 10PM where you can earn additional rewards for lowering and being more cognizant of your energy usage.

PSE has also helped us find a number of rebates on household items when you upgrade to more energy efficient ones. Right now, you could get \$1,500-\$2,400 for upgrading to a heat pump system, \$750-\$850 for upgrading to a heat pump water heater and more, depending on model and other factors. They have assistance programs for qualified customers.

Lastly, with the recent outages, PSE set up at different central locations to meet with customers, hand out snacks and water, and give updates on restoration efforts. Engaging with the community is such a big part of what they do, and they love when they see others doing the same.
