Update on Important Note from President Glen on District 5020 Conference

Update on March 20: Glen announced that he has booked a hotel room for Friday night, May 30, and President Elect Dale Robinson has booked a suite - you know what that means - **Party Suite!**

If you are a Silverdale Rotarian who will be serving on next year's board, or a new member in the club for fewer than 12 months, the club will reimburse you for your registration and room charges! March 9: I recently received a letter from our District 5020 Governor, Bill McGregor, appealing for our help. As you know, District 5020 straddles the US/Canada border. A growing number of Vancouver Island Rotarians have indicated they will not be attending this year's Conference in Tacoma on May 30-31. The two main reasons are the current exchange rate and resentment over President Trump imposing tariffs on Canada.

This has the potential to create a serious shortfall in attendance at the Conference. District 5020 has already committed to a minimum number of hotel nights, meal guarantees, and other fixed costs. Failure to meet these commitments will have significant financial implications for the District.

There is a way to address this pending problem – DG Bill is asking our Washington-based District 5020 members to help fill the gap by making a special effort to register and attend the Conference. He requests that our American members act now to register for the Conference and stay a minimum of one night at the Downtown Marriott in Tacoma.

This Conference features a roster of inspiring and accomplished speakers with incredible stories and experiences. In addition, the Conference will offer a variety of learning sessions tailored to meet the expressed needs of our District's clubs. This conference will be a vibrant mix of learning, camaraderie, and fun.

After reading DB Bill's letter, I sent him the following reply:

I recently saw a Paul Harris quote that may apply in this situation: "It has been the way of Rotary to focus thought upon matters in which members are in agreement, rather than upon matters in which they are in disagreement." I understand the frustration and distress of our friends north of the border; here's hoping that the shifting political tides that would pull us apart will prove no match for the powerful ideals that bind us together as Rotarians.

CKFR Crew & the Pacific Palisades Fire - Program on March 20

Elliott Brennan, a 10-year veteran firefighter/paramedic gave a riveting account of the two weeks he and his crew spent fighting the Palisades Fire. Two days after the fire exploded on January 6, CKFR got a request for assistance via formal agreement. They chose an engine and a 4-man crew and headed to California - driving 34 hours in two days to get to the Southern California.



They were assigned to the Beaumont neighborhood, pink with fire retardant, trying to protect existing homes. The reality of these fires being wind driven, is that if a home/building was already on fire, it was too late - just move on to the next structure where there was hope to save it. They learned the intensity of burning magnesium-lithium batteries in electric vehicles.

They worked 24 hours on and 24 hours off, and keeping morale up included things we normally take for granted, like making good coffee! On their 24 hours off, they did PT, training exercises, washed their engine, found healthy food, enjoyed the sunshine, and most importantly, maintained a positive attitude in the face of unimaginable destruction.



Before and after - earthquake standards require metal in the homes - all that was left.

The Damage

- 23,707 total acres for Palisades Fire
 - By comparison, the August Complex Fire in 2020 was 1,032,648 acres and cost over \$319 million in damages
 - · Lightning Complex Fire was \$308/acre of damage
 - · Palisades Fire was \$5,694,520 in damage per acre conservatively
- Immediately affected 83,622 people
- Destroyed 43,056 homes
- \$135,000,000,000 to \$150,000,000,000 in damages estimated so far.

They worked alongside neighbors, other WA crews, the National Guard, and mini horses delivering much appreciated 5,000 calorie lunches! Elliott remarked that it was an honor working alongside all these agencies and exceptional volunteers.

After Elliott's presentation, Rotarian/CKFR Chief Jay Christianson added some takeaways: building code changes, CPR training and Pulse Point, insurance changes, wildfire defense classes, notification systems - all to be looked at.

International Business as Mission - Program on March 13

On March 13 we heard an astonishing presentation from Jeff Samuelson about a nonprofit, International Business as Mission, that teaches budding entrepreneurs in the poorest of countries (e.g., Kazakhstan, Morocco, Syria, Indonesia, North Korea) how to start a successful business, and provides microloans that they pay back. The goal: 1 million new businesses in 15 years with a "hand up, not a handout." IBAM is funded entirely by donations, and its bedrock values emphasize honesty and integrity.



Jeff described classes where the students get certificates for completing the training including creating a business plan, budgeting, and finance. He gave examples of small businesses that have been successfully created: raising French bulldog puppies and finches for sale, fruit and vegetable gardens, egg incubations, breeding livestock, and gardens raising cut flowers.



Jeff would like to do a pilot in the U.S. – Kitsap County - but needs funding (\$5,000 per student) and advisors. See below for contact information.
