








The Silverdale Rotary Club has been partnering with Lisa Stirrett and the Creative Warrior Art Studio https://creative-warriors.com/ in Silverdale for many years, supporting her amazing humanitarian work with women in Burkina Faso, West Africa. Her glass art studio's "Products with a Purpose" raise funds for microloans and other work in that poor country where women "in their culture are considered valueless." Our club has been providing Duck Buck grants and even personal donations for microloans from Rotarians to empower women in that country, which is the least educated country in Africa.

Lisa was at our Rotary Club meeting on May 15 to thank us for the latest grant of \$3,500 to build a fence around a garden space to allow women to raise produce to feed their families plus sell the extra for income. Creative Warriors also installed irrigation and teaches the women sustainable farming techniques.

Rotary Clubs Partner to Bring Clean Water to Philippine Schools

In March 2025, the Rotary Club of Silverdale, Washington, and the Rotary Club of Orion, Philippines, brought clean, safe drinking water to three schools in the municipality of Orion, Bataan, through a District 5020 Matching Grant project.

Thanks to this collaborative effort, more than 1,500 students, teachers, and staff now have daily access to potable water, improving both health outcomes and educational conditions in the region.

The Need: A Daily Struggle for Safe Water

In many areas of the Philippines, access to clean drinking water remains inconsistent, especially in rural and semi-rural communities. While schools may have access to water, it's not always safe to drink. Contaminated water can lead to serious health issues, including gastrointestinal infections, which disrupt student attendance and affect learning outcomes.

In the schools served by this project, students often brought bottled water from home, adding an economic burden to families—or went without entirely. The solution: reverse osmosis systems.







The Solution: Reverse Osmosis Systems

To address this challenge, the clubs installed Reverse Osmosis (RO) water purification systems at:

- Justice E.A. Gancayco Memorial High School
- Bantan Elementary School
- Bataan School of Fisheries

Each system provides filtered, potable water on-site and can serve hundreds of users per day. At a cost of just USD \$1,000 per system, these installations deliver exceptional long-term value. The systems are also low maintenance, with filters needing to be changed only every few months, depending on usage levels.

A Partnership Built on Rotary Values

This project was made possible through a District 5020 Matching Grant, which helped amplify club contributions and extend Rotary's global reach. The Rotary Club of Orion, with its local knowledge and logistical support, managed the installation and community engagement. Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Silverdale helped fund the project and coordinate the international partnership.

This successful collaboration not only brought clean water to schools but also strengthened the Rotary network, proving once again that when Rotary clubs work together across borders, powerful change is possible.

Lasting Impact for Learning and Health

Access to clean drinking water at school does more than quench thirst—it improves concentration, reduces absences, and instills healthy hygiene habits from a young age. For teachers and staff, it means a safer, healthier workplace.


And for the entire community, it's a visible, tangible symbol of hope and progress—one that carries Rotary's name. Together, we are making a global difference—one drop at a time!
