- The top right of the ticket MUST be carefully, LEGIBLY, and COMPLETELY filled out.
- The ZIP and Billing Street Address must be correct for the Credit Card number, and the numbers MUST BE LEGIBLE.
- We only take VISA, Master Card, and American Express.
- If for any reason the credit card will not run, that ticket is considered Not Sold, the buyer has lost a chance to win, and our Club has lost the sale.

DACdb Verify Information, Logging In, and Getting Started

Verify your Rotary Information in DACdb by June 14. If you haven't already, please go to the email DACdb #2 and verify/update your information. Be sure to return to the email and click on Information Verified. Thank you for helping ensure our new DACdb database is correct!

DACdb (District and Club Database) - This pertains to Active and Honorary members of Silverdale Rotary Club. As we work to transition from Clubrunner to DACdb by June 30, the first thing to learn is how to log in.

Logging In – for many DACdb functions you will need to log in. Here is a short video https://vimeo.com/629294359.

Start at https://www.dacdb.com/. Your login name MAY be your Clubrunner login if you have been a Silverdale Rotarian a long time. But for the majority, your login is likely the email address you provided for your record. You MAY have to reset your password. If you don't know your login, contact Barbara Beagle at 360-710-5173 - text or call is the fastest way to contact her. Or email twobees2@earthlink.net.

QuickStart Guide 2022 - once logged in, click on the Support/Training tab at the top of the window, then on the left the DACdb UI QuickStart Guide 2022 which you can download/save.

DACdb University Tuesday Training. Also, once in the Support/Training tab, click on DACdb Training. Then click on DACdb University Tuesday Training, and the whole world of DACdb is available in great how-to videos.

DACdb Help – Also on the left side is link to FAQs and a comprehensive list of Help topics.

What's in it for me, you ask? Try the DACdb Mobile App! There is now a DACdb mobile smartphone app that has really cool features - like searching for, calling, e-mailing individual members, looking up calendar events to RSVP or Register, and lots more. All Active and Honorary Rotarians in Silverdale Rotary Club have access, behind their password, to Silverdale Rotary Club information, plus the entire District 5020 membership database! Search via your mobile app store for iPhone and Android and install it on your phone. Login with password to access all the member and Club information.

President's Project: Memorial to Jack Jensen at Newberry Hill Heritage Park

In March 2022, Silverdale Rotarians and volunteers laid out an area along one of the trails in Newberry Hill Heritage Park to create a memorial area for Jack Jensen (1929-2020), who was a member of Silverdale Rotary for 45 years.

The project, a brainchild of Co-Presidents Jennifer Strong and Erin Shannon pictured below,





was to create a park within the park, including a memorial bench with a commemorative plaque. They enlisted the help of Silverdale Rotarian Nancy Whitaker (pictured in center below), a volunteer Park Steward, who was instrumental in managing the project.



After removing mountains of Scotch broom and brush from the edge of the forest and making a clearing, they planted 64 native plants (e.g., rhododendrons, hawthorne, Oregon grape).

Co-President's Jennifer Strong and Erin Shannon knew they wanted to focus their President's Project on the outdoors, and truly wanted a place in the community to commemorate Jack. "Jack always had a smile and a joke, and you knew it was going to be a great day!" said Jennifer.

June 16 was dedication day!

A special thank-you goes to Rotarian Nancy Whitaker (also a Kitsap County volunteer Park Steward pictured on left with "Thank You" plant from Co-Presidents Jennifer and Erin) who was key to making the project and dedication a success. Nancy coordinated with Kitsap County Parks personnel to lay out the footprint of the memorial, and she also sourced all 64 native plants and supervised planting them!
