## Speaker April 25th, 2024

Rachel Wong, Executive Director Renton Rowing Club

Rachel Wong is an alumnus of Seattle University, where she was a walk-on with the Division I Women's Rowing team. Rachel began her career in coaching in 2016 at Green Lake Crew, where she served as the Assistant Novice Girls Coach. She went on to lead the Seattle Preparatory Novice Boys team, coaching the team to the program's first Regional Youth Championship title. In 2018, Rachel played a key role in founding the Seattle Scullers rowing team. For 3 years, she acted as their Long-Term Athlete Coordinator and Assistant Coach, managing recruitment efforts, community outreach, logistics, and communications. She began working at the Renton Rowing Center in July of 2021, and has helped to improve RRC's fundraising efforts, grow the coaching staff, and send RRC's first-ever athlete to the Youth National Championships last year.
