Speaker May 16th Jackie Montgomery - Family First Community Center



Jackie Montgomery is the Executive Director of the Family First Community Center Foundation, the philanthropic arm for Super Bowl Champion Seattle Seahawk, Doug Baldwin Jr. Opened June 2023 in the Cascade/Benson Hill neighborhood of Renton, the Family First Community Center offers resources and programming for all agesâ€"including a STEM maker space and a HealthPoint Medical Clinic to provide a holistic approach to serving the community and its people.

Jackie is also a founding member of SeaTac BMX, a local nonprofit that built a \$11Million BMX facility in the heart of South King County. SeaTac BMX provides an inclusive community and safe space that empowers youth and teaches life long skills through outdoor recreation, coaching, mentoring and racing bicycles!

Prior to transitioning into the nonprofit sector, Jackie worked for nearly two decades in broadcast media for some of the biggest television networks and sports franchises in America. Most recently, Jackie worked for the Seathle Seahawks as a reporter and content creator for seven years where she hosted a regular digital series, the Seahawks Daily, and produced an Emmy Award winning sports docuseries, Seahawks Stories


