

Program for January 6 Bill Knight Seattle Sports History

In a respected 43-year newspaper career, Bill Knight covered a wide range of sports action and events, including four Super Bowls, three Rose Bowl games, the World Cup soccer tournament, America's Cup sailing, the Henley Royal Regatta of rowing in England, the Goodwill Games in St. Petersburg, Russia, and pro and college all-star/playoff games in three major sports. Oh yes, and the Iditarod dog sled races in Alaska. (Did you ever try to talk while 1,000 dogs were barking simultaneously?)



A third-generation Seattleite, Knight was born during the Great Depression, grew up in Magnolia and made it through Queen Anne High School and

the University of Washington. He was hired in 1961 by legendary sports editor Royal Brougham at the Post-Intelligencer, Seattle's a.m. newspaper. Knight helped write the contentious history of Seattle sports at a time the city was achieving major league status. He served as sports editor for nine years.

Awards he has received include the Jim Murray Outstanding Sportswriter Award, the Mark Kauffman "award for excellence in covering thoroughbred racing," the NAEBM Directors Award as National Boating Writer of the Year, the Unlimited Hydroplane Racing National Media Award (three times), numerous Hearst Newspapers national writing awards, a "Career Achievement Award" from Seattle Basketball Legends, and the Bob Houbregs Service Award. After retiring in 1998, he became a Nordstrom Santa Claus and an adjunct professor at the University of Washington Bothell campus.

Ellenore Angelidis was recently approved for membership in our club. Her sponsor is Ezra Teshome and her induction is scheduled for January 20.

Ellenore is the founder and Board President of the Open Hearts Big Dreams Fund, where her role is to set strategy, lead the organization and fundraise. Open Hearts Big Dreams (www.openheartsbigdreams.org) is a an NGO of volunteers and a small business consulting organization that focuses on literacy, innovation, leadership and inclusion in Ethiopia. The NGO's main literacy project is creating, publishing, printing and distributing OHBD Ready Set Go Books. The goal is to help increase literacy by closing the gap of insufficient, colorful, mother tongue, early reader, children's books to practice reading. Since 2017, the organization has produced over 125 bilingual (with English) books in Amharic, Araan Oromo, Tigrinya, Somali, Anuak, Dizin, Kiswahili and French. The books are printed in

Ethiopia and more than 300,000 copies have been distributed in the country. The books are also sold, with all proceeds going to fund the project.

Prior to founding Open Hearts Big Dreams, Ellenore was an executive at Amazon.

She is a graduate of the University of Loyola (Chicago), where she graduated summa cum laude with a BA in Political Science. She then went on to get a J.D. degree from the University of Chicago Law School.

Ellenore's community activities are related to her NGO; she provides volunteer coaching and mentoring to emerging leaders. Her special interests are education, empowerment, leadership and innovation. Her hobbies include traveling, writing, gardening and baking. Besides English, she speaks Dutch and "a bit of" German, Greek and Spanish.


