
> With one phone call or email, NEST members access enriching events and activities for learning,



Kenassa said he hopes to find a job working with people, like customer service or front desk reception, rather than working

Kenassa's job coach, Anja Post, attended the meeting with him. She represents Mainstay at Seattle Central College—a program that helps job seekers with disabilities.


