Chris Reykdal


The state of Washington's public schools coming out of Covid

Candidates for Service Fund Board Announced (by Paula Laschober, Service Fund Board President)



As business representatives, we can provide an actual interview exercise where students can share their resume, experiences and skills. The PFW Mock Interviews give students the opportunity to practice interviewing and get immediate feedback from Rotarians after the interview. Students come away with increased confidence during interviews, an important component in their job search. Each student will leave with a certificate of completion after being introduced to our club by a Rotarian that interviewed them.

What is Partners for Work (PFW)? It is one of our club's treasured projects and it is a Rotary District 5030 project that creates employment opportunities for people with developmental disabilities by linking Rotarian business leadership and job candidates to find meaningful paid work. Since 2003 Partners for Work has helped create 130 jobs in District 5030 thus far! The University District Rotary Club has helped create three jobs, had Mock Interviews and hired a Greeter for the last ten years. In our district, people can be found working within a variety of occupations

and industries. Employees from Partners for Work are office assistants, warehouse/manufacturing stocking associates, membership/service assistants, and utility/janitorial assistants.

This project focuses on creating new opportunities for people who have traditionally been left out of the job market by having Rotarians become more aware of individual skills and abilities that exist within their own communities.

The project's target population is people who are over 18 years of age who have developmental disabilities and want to work. These individuals have valuable skills to offer the workplace, yet their employment rate is very low (30%) and many cannot meet the established job requirements set by businesses' human resource departments. Rotarians are often the top people in their companies and play a key networking and leadership role in helping open the door towards paid work.

Returning Club Member Lawrie Payne (by Lawrie Payne)



I was born in Portage la Prairie, Manitoba, Canada in 1942. I moved to Alberta at six and stayed at several locations until I left Canada for a graduate education.

Career:

I graduated from the university of Alberta in 1974 with a BA in Economics and after was emloyed but Pan American Petroleum (now AMOCO) in the land department. Our job was to negotiate drilling syndicates between ourselves and other oil companies.

I had a thirst for the technical aspects of the business and after 3 years decided to become a Geologist. I attended the University of Miami to pick up sciences I

hadn't previously received and then entered Columbia University in New York, graduating with a Masters degree in Marine Geology.

I then started my real career by working as a Geologist for Kerr McGee in Oklahoma City. I loved the work, had a great boss/teacher and managed to discover a large gasfield.

After 2 years I was hired to go back to Canada to work for a small exploration company. After 4 years, I was transferred to London to manage foreign activities and then came back to Calgary to run the company. This was the beginning of my lifetime career with small companies, exploring in several areas of the world. I started my own company and, with several subsequent companies that I started, pursued exploration and production in several areas including Canada, the North Sea and Middle East, living in both Calgary and London (again). Then I retired and moved to Seattle.

Rotary:

I first joined Rotary in about 2014. After looking at several clubs, I chose the University District club because of its size and involvement in both domestic and foreign activities. Then in 2019 I decided to move back to Canada and settled on the Sunshine Coast in British Columbia, near Vancouver, where I selected a home on the Georgia Strait. I joined the Gibsons Rotary club which was small, but I really enjoyed the membership. After four years, I tired of the relative isolation and moved back to Seattle in November of 2023 to be closer to family and friends, most of whom were Rotary members I had met before in the University District club. While I was not very active in specific committees, I participated in local activities and finances. I included a trip to Viet Nam with Son Michael. I also traveled to Ethiopia with Ezra. I was a contributor to funding of the University club and the Rotary Foundation.

Education: University of Alberta. 1961-1964, BA Economics; University of Miami, 1967-1968; Columbia University, New York, 1968-1970, MA Marine Geology

Family:

I have a son Brendan and daughter Suzanne in Vancouver, and a son Larry and daughter Cindy in Seattle, as well as 5 grandkids. I was married twice, the first to Muffy who was the mother of my four children, and to Linda who was my cherished companion later in life. Both I lost to the ultimate master. I have been a bachelor for 18 years.

In conclusion, I have enjoyed the profession that I chose and was lucky to have landed the business, travel and personal opportunities that I did. I have been fortunate to have experienced and loved the relationships I have had. My children have given me so much pleasure and the determination to live and to love them as long as I can.



Notes from March 5 Service Fund Board Meeting (by Paula Laschober)

The Service Fund Board voted to change meeting dates from first Tuesday of the month to first Monday. This will allow our President-Elect, Linda Fukuda, to attend, as well as candidates for next year's Board.

Amendments to the Service Fund bylaws were approved by the Board, and will be presented to the members for approval at a future meeting. The amended bylaws were reviewed by an attorney to make sure we were complying with the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act.

Bill Herkes, Board Treasurer, continues to search for a new accountant for the Service Fund. One candidate will be interviewed March 14. Bill is also researching ways the Service Fund might be able to accept on-site credit card donations.

The following applications for grant funding were approved:

International Service Committee

- I Transform Myself to Transform My World, Colombia: \$19,582.50 (Global grant, includes \$5,883 from 5 D5030 clubs in addition to \$13,699.50 from UDRC).
- Bukobero Community Health Center, Uganda: \$35,406 (\$6,000 from UDRC, the rest from 14 other Rotary Clubs, a D5030 matching grant and private donations)
- Bukobero Community Health Center, Uganda: \$31,169 (\$5,369 from UDRC, the rest from 17 other Rotary Clubs and private donations)
- Greenhouses, Mexico: \$10,000




