Program for March 22

Dan Peterson, Tashkent Sister City



Dan Peterson is a former president of the Seattle-Tashkent Sister City Association (STSCA) and lead author of the recently-published, 300-page commemorative book, *Seattle & Tashkent: 50 Years of a Remarkable Sister City Friendship, 1973-2023*. This book chronicles the history of the sister-city association, formed during the height of the Cold War, through the efforts of Wes Uhlman, former mayor of Seattle and long-time Rotarian, along with many others.

In 1973, Seattle and Tashkent, Uzbekistan became the first Soviet-American sister cities. Their leaders and citizens created an alliance that has endured for five decades! Hundreds of people on both the Seattle and Tashkent sides have selflessly contributed their time, energy, and passion to make this relationship successful. Both cities maintain parks as visible reminders of this affiliation: Tashkent Park in Seattle (established in 1974) and the Seattle Peace Park in Tashkent (established in 1988). During his career, besides being a volunteer for many organizations (Special Olympics, Accent on Understanding, and STSCA), Dan was a mental health therapist, teacher, principal in both Seattle Public Schools and Shoreline Public Schools, consultant to OSPI (Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction), adjunct professor at Seattle University, and author of the book, *Comparing America's Public Schools: Lessons from Top Scoring Nations* (published in 2020). Besides being passionate about education and peaceful international relationships, Dan is an avid backpacker, having hiked the Pacific Crest Trail across Washington, from the Columbia River to Canada, and countless other trails.

The PFW Mock Interviews give students the opportunity to practice interviewing and get immediate feedback from Rotarians after the interview. Students come away with increased confidence during interviews, an important component in their job search. Each student will leave with a certificate of completion after being introduced to our club by a Rotarian that interviewed them.

What is Partners for Work (PFW)? It is one of our club's treasured projects and it is a Rotary District 5030 project that creates employment opportunities for people with developmental disabilities by linking Rotarian business leadership and job candidates to find meaningful paid work. Since 2003 Partners for Work has helped create 130 jobs in District 5030 thus far! The University District Rotary Club has helped create three jobs, had Mock Interviews and hired a Greeter for the last ten years. In our district, people can be found working within a variety of occupations

and industries. Employees from Partners for Work are office assistants, warehouse/manufacturing stocking associates, membership/service assistants, and utility/janitorial assistants.

This project focuses on creating new opportunities for people who have traditionally been left out of the job market by having Rotarians become more aware of individual skills and abilities that exist within their own communities.

The project's target population is people who are over 18 years of age who have developmental disabilities and want to work. These individuals have valuable skills to offer the workplace, yet their employment rate is very low (30%) and many cannot meet the established job requirements set by businesses' human resource departments. Rotarians are often the top people in their companies and play a key networking and leadership role in helping open the door towards paid work.

Update of the University Rotary Service Fund Bylaws *(by Jane Wiegenstein)*

Background

An update to Bylaws governing the University Rotary Service Fund was inaugurated in July of 2023. The existing Bylaws dated from 2017, so a thorough review made sense, particularly in view of further policy development over the six year period and of the passage in 2022 of an update to the Washington law governing non-profit corporations. A committee of three Service Board members (Lael Ross, Lisa Edwards and Jane Wiegenstein) produced an initial draft based on their own review and input from others on the Service Board, which was reviewed with the entire Service Board in September. At that time it was suggested that a lawyer with the requisite expertise in the Washington Non-Profit Corporation Act of 2022 review the draft and clarify one or two questions that had been raised. Marisa Broggel identified a lawyer (Alicia Levy) who completed the legal review in late January 2024. Once changes were incorporated, the Service Board voted at their March meeting to submit the draft Revised and Amended Bylaws to the entirety of the University District Rotary Club membership for approval.

Summary of Key Changes

Many of the changes updated the Bylaws to reflect actual practice, provided clarification or more specificity, or were purely editorial in nature. Substantive changes are listed below.

Article / Section	Change
IV / 2	The president of the UDRC was made a voting member of the board (this is in addition to the president-elect),
V / 6-9	Additional standing committees were added to the Nominating Committee, i.e., the Investment Committee, the Gift Acceptance Committee, and the Bylaws Committee.
IX / 1-7	Article IX (Gifts) was re-written to reflect the Gift Acceptance Policy that was implemented in spring 2023. The revised Article IX is much more condensed because the detail is now contained in the much more comprehensive Gift Acceptance Policy (GAP). Lisa Edwards (who was on the GAP committee) produced a cross-walk showing where content removed from Article IX was covered in the GAP. Article IX now refers to the GAP and where it can be found.

Service Fund members (same as club members) will vote on the proposed amended bylaws at the April 5 lunch meeting. The current and revised bylaws are attached to the message transmitting this bulletin.

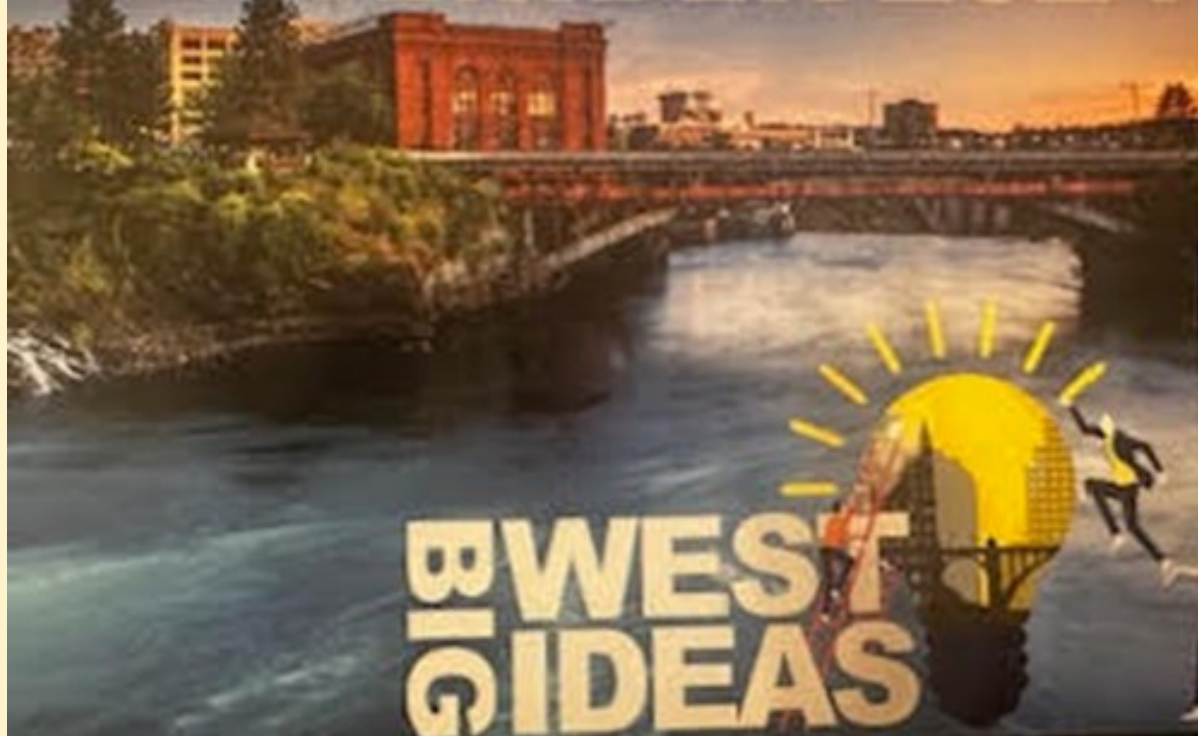
