Scott Allard

Evans School of Public Policy

Scott W. Allard is the Daniel J. Evans Endowed Professor of Social Policy at the Evans School of Public Policy and Governance at the University of Washington with research expertise in American politics, inequality, and social welfare policy. He also is the Associate Dean for Research and Engagement at the Evans School.

Dr. Allard joined the UW as a professor of public policy and governance in 2014. At UW, he is an affiliate of the [Center for Studies in Demography and Ecology \(CSDE\)](#) and of the West Coast Poverty Center. He is a research affiliate of the [Institute for Research on Poverty at the University of Wisconsin-Madison](#), where he served on the National Advisory Board from 2018-2020. He also served as a nonresident senior fellow at the [Brookings Institution's Metropolitan Policy Program](#) from 2010 to 2020. He previously held faculty positions at the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University (2000-03), the Department of Political Science at Brown University (2003-08), and in the School of Social Service Administration at the University of Chicago (2008-14).

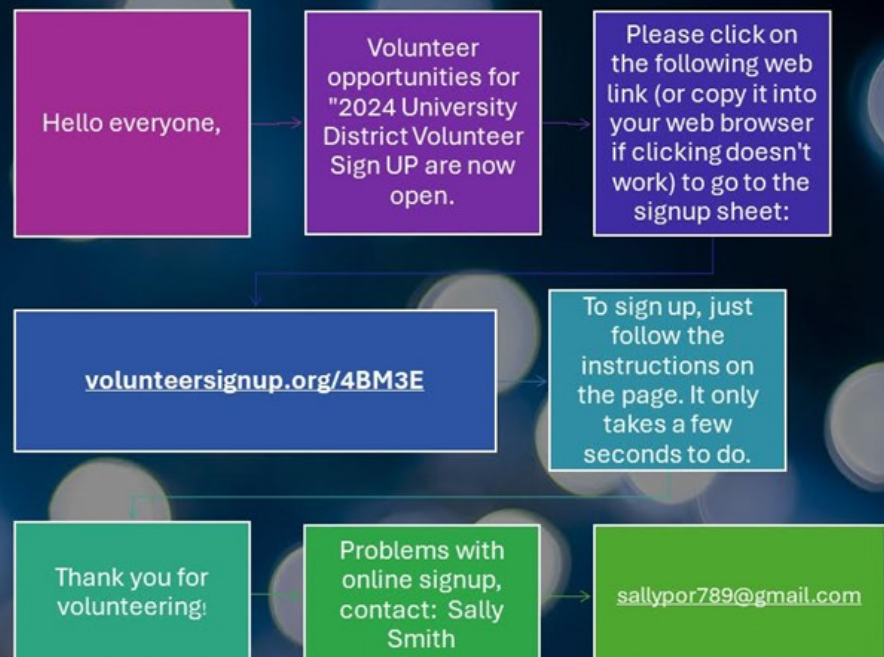

Rotary District 5030 Lithium Battery Recycling Event

Saturday, April 20, 2024, 10AM to 3Pm

11 locations throughout the greater Seattle Puget Sound Area

The District 5030 Environmental Sustainability Committee is launching a very ambitious Rotary campaign to recycle lithium ion batteries throughout our District. These are batteries that come in cell phones, laptops, tablets, power drills, e-bikes, electric vehicles and anything that is rechargeable.

Lithium-ion batteries are a phenomenal technology that can propel us into a clean energy and transportation future. All lithium-ion batteries are made up of varying amounts of critical minerals like cobalt, nickel, copper and lithium. What is incredible is these minerals can be recycled almost infinitely.

Yet, today, only 17 percent of e-waste and less than 5 percent of lithium-ion battery containing devices get recycled. The overwhelming majority of these devices end up in landfills. Recycling creates a tremendous opportunity to “urban mine” old products and build new, sustainable product while offsetting our need to terrestrially mine.

Last year, District 5030 had a successful, but limited, lithium battery recycling event. This year, District 5030 Rotarians will unite again, under the leadership of Dave Spicer as District Chair and Sally Porter Smith as part of the District leadership team. We are significantly expanding the geographical scope and offering 11 sites throughout Puget Sound for community members to recycle lithium batteries
