- The 31st mission: 10 days in Viet Nam with stops in Hanoi, Hai Phong, Ha Long, Danang, Hoi An and Saigon.
- Opportunities: experience first hand the beauty of the country and people of VN, and the differences made by Rotary and Rotarians. We'll connect with a team of Rotarians from districts in New York.

New Member Applications Approved by Club Board April 24

Seth Barribeau describes his personal and professional background as:

"Having grown up moving between South Africa, the US, and New Zealand I have always viewed myself as a global citizen. I was fortunate to have been a Rotary Exchange Student to Jakarta Indonesia in 1996-97, and this was a defining experience that further cemented my desire to explore. I went on to study zoology and psychology through graduate school in New Zealand and conducted postdoctoral research at Kyoto University (Japan), Emory University (USA), The ETH Zurich (Switzerland), and The Wissenschafts College Berlin (Germany) before taking faculty positions--first at East Carolina University (University of North Carolina) and then the University of Liverpool (UK). After a move to Seattle for my partner's job in 2021 I have pivoted to working at a biotech startup (Ozette Technologies) where I work as the principal data scientist. There we are building a platform to interrogate immunological data at speed and scale to provide rapid insights into the immune system."



Seth is a graduate of the University of Canterbury, Christchurch, New Zealand, with a B.Sc. Degree in Psychology and Zoology, and a Ph.D. in Zoology. He is a subject editor for *Functional Ecology*, and the *Journal of Insect Science*, as well as an expert reviewer for scientific journals and national and international granting organizations (NSF [USA], BBSRC [UK], NERC [UK], SNSF [CH]). He says his special interests are global health and evolutionary biology. His hobbies are music, photography and travel. In addition to English, he speaks Indonesian, German and Japanese (poorly, by his own admission). He lives in the Phinney Ridge neighborhood of Seattle.
