

In Memorium—Louise Leader

Our long-time member, Louise Leader, passed away on April 27 in Columbia, South Carolina, where she moved a couple years ago to be closer to her children. She was 93. Her funeral, attended by her family and close friends, was held Sunday, May 21, at Abbey View cemetery in Brier, Washington. Brenda and Richard Dimond and Kay and Ed Sider represented our club at the service.





Louise, whose classification was Education Administration, joined our club in 2007 and remained an active member through the 2019-2020 Rotary year. She was an early and active supporter of women everywhere. She worked hard on our Scholarship Committee seeking out women whose life circumstances would benefit from financial help toward a college education.

She also served on our International Service Committee and co-sponsored educational projects in Colombia. Her most recent one, in the 2012-2013 year, was the purchase of computers, equipment and furniture for the library and kitchen of the Ricardo Nieto afterschool and childcare center of the low-income community of Altos de la Florida on the outskirts of Bogota. Louise, along with her late husband and former UDRC president Alan

Leader, established our club's on-going relationship with the Centenario Rotary Club of Bogota. The club was our partner in the Ricardo Nieto center project, as well as in the establishment of small business cooperative projects and, most recently, a project to empower girls and young women. The initial Colombia connection was the result of a Rotary Peace Scholar sponsorship by our club. Our club's first project with the Centenario RC, sponsored by Louise and Alan, was a 2009 Rotary Foundation matching grant to provide play equipment to the Ricardo Nieto center.

At the service, Kay noted that "Louise was a tiger about recognizing women's achievements and pointing out sexist language at our meetings. She was very bright and she did not suffer fools lightly. At the same time, she was incredibly kind and supportive. We will greatly miss her." - Opportunities: experience first hand the beauty of the country and people of VN, and the differences made by Rotary and Rotarians. We'll connect with a team of Rotarians from districts in New York.
