Program for June 14 Linda Thompson Black United Negro College Fund

Linda Thompson-Black is currently the UNCF Pacific Northwest Area Development Director and a distinguished and longstanding educational leader, advisor to the Mayor of Seattle, Councilmembers, foundations, and corporate leaders across the country. She was the lead staff on the original Seattle educational summit that led to the \$49 million families and education levy.



She has devoted her professional career to bringing communities together to support the

training and development of minority students and young people generally. She worked for a national student achievement organization and replicated programs nationally. They grew from serving 500,000 students and families to serving over 2 million students annually.

She understands that providing young people with educational opportunities changes the trajectory of their life. It can help break the cycle of poverty and help students obtain living wage jobs. This will allow graduates to use their training to solve problems and make the world a better place. This takes resources.

Linda has taken the UNCF Pacific Northwest area to the next level, working with the area leadership council members, developing a strong vision and strategic plan and then implementing it. Last year she raised over \$5,885,000. This is up from \$300,000, when she arrived five years ago.




New Club Member Applicant


