"What was it like to open the new Laurelhurst Aegis?", I asked.

- Opening a lot of boxes.
- And when he was in front of 200 guests at one of their events and feeling so good he declared he had "the best team".

Prior to joining Aegis, and during COVID, he co-founded a staffing platform, ZOONORMAL, a platform to help unemployed people in the hospitality business. He helped 200 people get back to work.

David was General Manager at The Sound Hotel-a Tapestry Collection by Hilton, located in the heart of Belltown steps from Amazon Worldwide Headquarters. He was also General Manager for over 9 years at the Inn at the Market, a boutique hotel tucked in the center of Pike Place market. He was able to get the IATM to be the best hotel in Seattle and 10th best hotel in the US in its category. He says he loved the Market: it was its own community. Prior to Inn at the Market, he was the GM of The Hotel Max.

I read some remarks where David noted: "You know the true meaning of Servant Leadership- gratitude knowing you are a support in a person's journey, helping them create new personas to live out."

- That prompted me to ask him for practical tips about keeping hotel guests happy. His answer:
- Simply welcome them with a good morning and good evening.
- Recognition of who they are and why they are staying with you.
- Address concerns in real time and fix them quickly.
- Lastly, thank them and invite them to return.

David has been a leader in his profession. He was President of the Seattle Hotel Association and Washington Hospitality Association and he served on the Pike Place Market Foundation.

David has a degree in Hospitality Administration/Management from Kapi'olani Community College (Honolulu HI) and a 3-year diploma in Hotel, Motel and Restaurant Management from the Fiji School of Hotel and Catering. David and his wife, Sally, live in the Greenwood area. His daughter, Ivy, is a nurse.

Something unique about David which I hope you read in the bulletin: He grew up in a culture of hospitality in Fiji, where he spent childhood. His family created the Orchid Island Cultural Center. Orchid Island is a natural river formation near Suva, Fiji. Raymond Burr was a partner in this center.

New Club Member Inducted June 28, 2024


My fellow Rotarians,

On June 28 a great group of D5030 Governors gathered at the home of Rosemary and Luis Aragon to enjoy one of the items from our Fundraiser: a typical Oaxaca dinner, hosted by Rosemary, Susan Solá, Wendy Riley and Marilee Fuller. There was lots of lively conversation and reminiscing about leadership experiences (both inspiring and funny), projects in our district and ideas for the future. The guests who purchased the dinner were Ezra & Yobi Teshome, PDG Kae Peterson, DG Kaj Pedersen & Claire, PDG Alan Merry and DGE Rachele Bouchand, her husband Blaise and very cute 2nd-grade daughter Charlotte.

Outside in the lovely evening, the group toasted with wine, tequila, Oaxaca mezcal, Mexican beer and *agua de jamaica* (hibiscus flower water) and enjoyed *molletes* (toasted french bread with beans, cheese and salsa), guacamole with chips, and jicama with lime and chile on the patio with a view of the 6th Fairway of the Sandpoint Country Club.



The 4 hosts—Susan, Wendy, Rosemary and Marilee—are at the head of the table.

The main meal followed inside, with chicken mole

enchiladas, Mexican rice, *frijoles de olla* (black beans with *epazote*), chayote squash, *esquites* (off-the-cob grilled Mexican street corn salad), and corn tortillas. For dessert we had guava *ate con queso* (fruit paste with cheese slices) and a delicious *pastel de tres leches* (three milk cake) with a candle to celebrate Marilee's birthday that same night to a playing of the *Las Mañanitas* birthday song. The mezcal tasters continued to

sip the *espadín* and *tobalá* varieties in typical tiny *copas* and debate their favorites, smooth or smoky. A little goes a long way!

By purchasing this dinner at our fundraiser, our guests were able to have a nice reunion while enjoying some typical food from the N. Oaxaca region of Mexico where our club supports a project to help subsistence farmers to grow healthy, nutritious food under difficult conditions. Our Mexican Rotarian partners gave us the mezcal for the dinner.

At our June 28 meeting, Judy Lovelace informed the club that **Gary Corbett's wife, Consuelo**, had passed away.






