For over seven years University District Rotary, along with various U.S. partner clubs, has collaborated with the RC of Bellavista Atizapán outside Mexico City to bring assistance to subsistence farmers of the Mixtec Region of N. Oaxaca State. Some of our

members have visited this project and have invariably come away with great admiration for the small, remote farm families that are trying to survive increasing drought and unpredictable rains to support their families, mostly without aid from outside sources.

As water became scarcer, the Bellavista RC stepped in to help--the farmers' selfreliance, hard work and grit could only go so far. Many men were having to leave their farms to look for work elsewhere, a hard blow to the families and the communities. The drip-irrigation greenhouses that Rotary has helped to install can supply an entire family with vegetables all year round—if sufficient water is available. With the increasing drought, larger, in-ground cisterns are now needed to feed the greenhouses, and this year our International Service Committee has approved our participation in a larger Rotary Global Grant with Bellavista RC.

It has been a privilege for us to help to preserve a beautiful but threatened way of life that keeps farm families together on their ancestral land. In April 2024 Doug Frick, Paula Laschober and Susan Sola travelled with some of the Bellavista Rotarians to visit the newest Rotary-funded cisterns. Our visual presentation will show our trip, the cistern inauguration and our celebration with the farmers.





UDRC to Participate in Solid Ground's Day of Service, Friday, August 23! (by Marella Alejandrino)



Roll up your sleeves and join us Friday, August 23, from 9am-noon for Solid Ground's Day of Service Celebrating 50 Years! You'll be in good company with 300+ Solid Ground community members as we gather across five Seattle volunteer sites to plant and tend to garden beds, beautify parks, clean up our Solid Ground Transportation's ACCESS bus fleet, and more!

Our Club will be volunteering at the Magnuson Park site. Solid Ground houses 400+ people at the Sand Point Campus at Magnuson Park. The campus provides permanent supportive housing, affordable permanent housing, and onsite support services for formerly homeless families and individuals. Since 1999, several thousand people have stayed at Sand Point Housing in their journeys from homelessness to stability. Folks who sign up for this project will meet at a location in the Sand Point neighborhood near campus (exact location TBD) for coffee and pastries, then get to work beautifying Magnuson Park. Seattle Parks and Recreation will have all the tools and instructions we need to complete our jobs.







First UDRC Happy Hour of 2024-25

Notes from University Rotary Service Fund Meeting August 5, 2024 (by Paula Laschober)

The Service Fund (Foundation) keeps its long-term investments in Vanguard accounts. There are two primary accounts: the Permanent Fund and the Bayles Fund. The latter is dedicated solely to scholarships. In December 2022, at the request of certain club members, the Service Fund Board voted to move the stock portion of the Bayles Fund from a total stock market index fund to a social index (ESG) fund. Since the Board had no prior experience with an ESG investment, they voted to examine it after 18 months (June 30, 2024) to see how it was doing. Since the ESG investment has had higher returns than the total stock market index fund (26.2% vs 21.8%) over the 18-month period, the Board decided to leave the ESG investment as is. However, they also voted to check it again at June 30, 2025.

The Board also examined the returns for both the Permanent Fund and the Bayles Fund in light of the Service Fund's investment policies and determined to use \$50,000 from the former and \$30,000 from the latter for this year's Service Fund budget that funds our club's service projects. Thanks to Gary Corbett, chair of the Service Fund's Investment Committee, for making the relevant calculations. Given that the Bayles Fund had a surplus over the amount planned, the Board added \$29,000 from that fund for scholarships. Our 2023-24 fundraising and remainder in our bank account after liabilities (at 6/30/24), less a buffer of \$5,000, added \$106,900 available for our service projects. Therefore, the Board approved the total of \$215,900 for this year's Service Fund Budget. Per the bylaws, President Linda Fukuda will develop the line item and committee budget for the year.

Finally, the Board approved Angie Jimenez as a new member, to finish the two-year term of Jane Wiegenstein.

The Foundation of the Rotary Club of the University District is called "University Rotary Service Fund." It is a charitable organization with a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. The Service Fund's EIN, or tax ID, is 91-1123239.
