


### Kim Herman, President, Friends of the Dominican Republic Peace Corps and Rotary

Kim Herman grew up in the Spokane Valley, graduated from WSU in June of 1967, and immediately entered Peace Corps training for his two years of service in the Dominican Republic (DR) as a Community Development Specialist. As a Volunteer, he helped build schools, agricultural access roads, and an agricultural warehouse.





Oregon and Washington, and retired in 2019 after serving 35 years as the first Executive Director of the WA State Housing Finance Commission.



He became President of Friends of the Dominican Republic (FDR) in 2012, an affiliate group of the National Peace Corps Association, representing more than 5,000 former Peace Corps Volunteers who served in the DR.

Kim will be speaking about FDR's continuing programs in the DR and Rotary's ongoing relationship with the Peace Corps.

<u>Linda Thompson-Black</u> has applied to transfer to our club from Seattle 4. Her sponsor is Suzanne Griffin.

Linda is currently the UNCF Pacific Northwest Area Development Director and a distinguished and longstanding educational leader, as well as advisor to the Mayor of Seattle, Councilmembers, foundations, and corporate leaders across the country. She was the lead staff on the original Seattle educational summit that led to the \$49 million families and education levy.



She has devoted her professional career to bringing communities together to

support the training and development of minority students and young people generally. She worked for a national student achievement organization and replicated programs nationally. They grew from serving 500,000 students and families to serving over two million students annually.

She understands that providing young people with educational opportunities changes the trajectory of their life. It can help break the cycle of poverty and help students obtain living wage jobs. It allows graduates to use their training to solve problems and make the world a better place. This takes resources.

Linda has taken the UNCF Pacific Northwest area to the next level, working with the area leadership council members, developiong a strong vision and strategic plan, and then implementing it. Last year she raised over \$5,885,000. This is up from \$300,000, when she arrived five years ago.

Linda holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Washington. She lists her special interest as education and her community activities as the Greater Seattle Chapter of the Links and Seattle Girlfriends.
