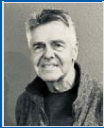
Get Ready for Rotaryfest!

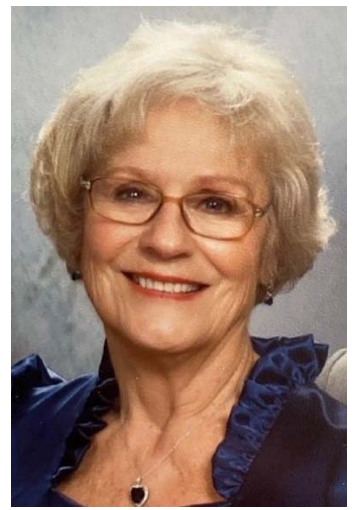

Our Satellite Meetings will resume January 2025!

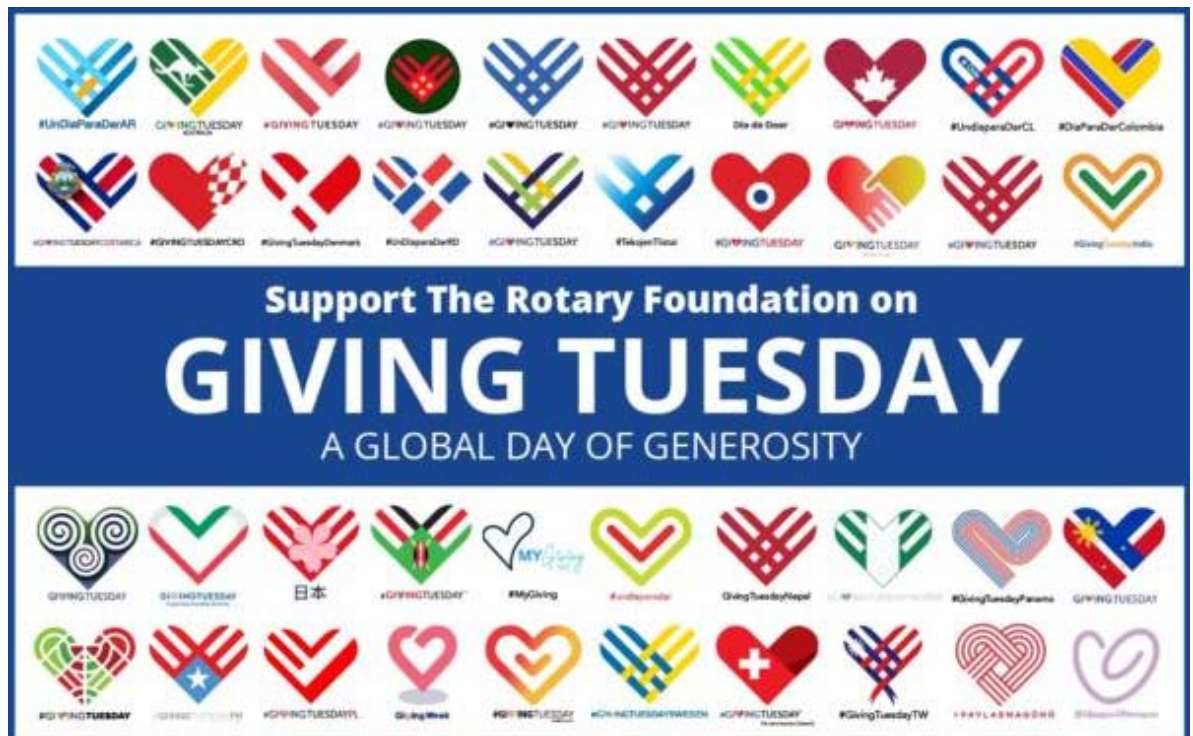

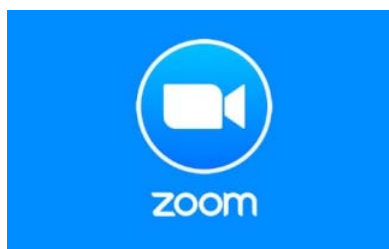
