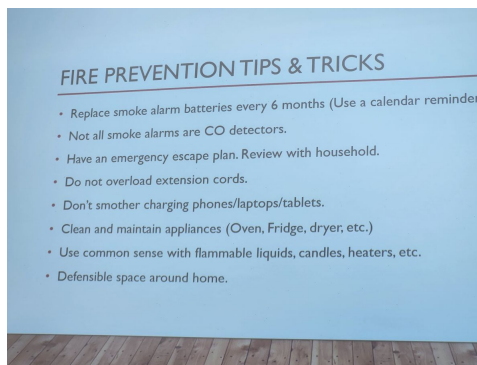


County Fire Marshall outlines prevention tips
