#### PROGRAM

KIM EDMONDSON introduced Hayven Chase, Miss Gem State Stampede. She is a delightfully ambitious Rodeo Queen with a service dog and spoke about her diagnosis on August 3, 2012, and the resulting experience with Type 1 diabetes. Hayven explained the diagnosis as simply as an autoimmune disease that originates when cells that make insulin (beta cells) are destroyed by the immune system.

Hayven manages her symptoms with the assistance of a diabetes service dog, her "sugar sniffing sidekick, Scentinel", and also through an insulin pump. She is proud of the many accomplishments she has had, as she will not let Type 1 diabetes stop her! She received her state FFA degree in 2022, won the Idaho FFA Small Animal Production & care proficiency award in 2021 & 2022, competed for Miss Teen Rodeo Idaho, met Met Miss Rodeo America 2022 Hailey Frederiksen, held four playday royalty titles, held the title of Miss Bonner County Rodeo in 2020 & 2021, and currently holds the title of Miss Gem State Stampede 2023.

According to the Mayo Clinic, "Type 1 diabetes, once known as juvenile diabetes or insulin-dependent diabetes, is a chronic condition. In this condition, the pancreas makes little or no insulin. Insulin is a hormone the body uses to allow sugar (glucose) to enter cells to produce energy. This causes increased thirst, frequent urination, hunger, sudden weight loss and weakness.

Different factors, such as genetics and some viruses, may cause type 1 diabetes. Although type 1 diabetes usually appears during childhood or adolescence, it can develop in adults. Even after a lot of research, type 1 diabetes has no cure. Treatment is directed toward managing the amount of sugar in the blood using insulin, diet and lifestyle to prevent complications.

Type 1 symptoms can appear suddenly and include feeling more thirsty than usual; urinating a lot; bed-wetting in children who have never wet the bed during the night; feeling very hungry; losing weight without trying; feeling irritable or having other mood changes; feeling tired and weak; having blurry vision.
