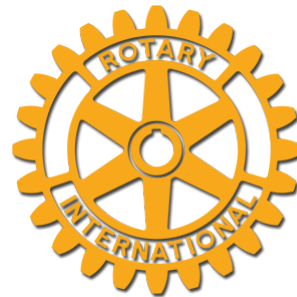

ASHLEY LENZ introduced Dr. Rolland Kent, NW Specialty Hospital – Robotic Surgery

Dr. Kent currently performs 400 – 500 spines surgeries a year, and more than 400 are robotic-assisted. Robotic-assisted spine surgeries provide more accuracy, efficiency and reproducible results than standard surgeries. It is, however, another tool for a surgeon, not an end-all / be-all.

Robotic-assisted spine surgeries provide capability for screw placement, interbody placement, hardware removal, delivery of biologic materials, and osteotomies. The benefits include: small surgical footprint; less blood loss; shorter hospital stay; shorter OR time; less surgeon cognitive load; less OR staff radiation exposure; and minimal muscle stripping.

It does not, however, replace the common sense of a surgeon. It does not make a bad surgeon good, it can make a good surgeon excellent.
