PROGRAM

LARRY GILL introduced Jenny Andrews with Malaria Partners International. Jennie is an almost 30 year Rotarian and a member and Past President of the Bellevue Breakfast Rotary Club. She went on a polio vaccination trip in Ethiopia and her life was forever changed. She transitioned from healthcare philanthropy and began working in global health.

The origins of [Malaria Partners International](#) began in 2009 with Rotarians from the Seattle 4 Club founding and leading a malaria eradication project. Fast forward to 2013 and Rotarian Malaria Partners was formed as a 501(c)3 organization and by 2020 the organization had a refreshed name, expanded mission of advocacy and education. The website explains, "We are Bridge Builders – connecting Rotary and the broader global health community to prevent malaria and address its effects on maternal and child health".

Malaria is a parasitic disease and could be the greatest killer of humankind. The US was able to eradicate malaria through the use of DDT, widely used in the 1940s as the first modern synthetic insecticide, prior to considerable regulation in the 1950-60s. Unfortunately, malaria infection is a daily occurrence in sub-Saharan Africa. The person is infected via mosquito bite, the malaria goes into the liver, enters the bloodstream, multiplies and attacks the red blood cells. This causes anemia, among other things, and grave illness. Adults and children are so sick for quite some time that it causes loss of work and education, thus increasing levels of poverty for those affected.

Rotary Clubs are working through the Rotary International grant process. Rotarians are assisting in Zambia, Uganda, Zimbabwe and in 10 areas in District 9101, the West Africa coastal and inland areas. Rotary clubs entered into the small grant program are matched with up to \$5,000 from the Gates Foundation. And currently there are five global grants underway on this project.

In 2019, Rotary International developed the "Programs of Scale" grant and invested \$2 million into the Malaria Partners project. This was matched by \$2 million each from the Gates Foundation and World Vision. The \$6 million investment is working to train over 2,500 health care workers in rural Africa to reach and serve those affected by malaria in their villages for more effective treatment. The health care workers are chosen by tribal leaders due to their community-based focus and high levels of literacy. The goal is to train the health care workers on how to test and treat malaria, diarrhea, and respiratory illnesses, and even to distribute polio vaccines if there is an outbreak. Workers are provided bicycles for rapid transportation within the rural areas for more effective response times.

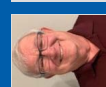
