

WHO acknowledges gratefully? the **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation**, which provided US\$ 208.57 million in 2023 to support polio outbreak response campaigns, surge capacity and research activities.

WHO would like to extend gratitude to **Rotary International** for the generous contribution of US\$ 69.19 million in 2023 to support technical assistance in headquarters and the African and Eastern Mediterranean Regions, operational costs for SIAs in Afghanistan and Pakistan, global outbreak response, surveillance in Nigeria and research activities.

WHO is very grateful to **US CDC** for the generous contribution of US\$ 47.67 million to global polio eradication efforts in 2023 including support for technical assistance, laboratory strengthening and the GPEI STOP Program.

WHO would like to thank **USAID** for the generous contribution of US\$ 42.97 million in 2023 for global polio surveillance.

WHO thanks the **Gates Philanthropic Partners** who provided US\$ 11.2 million in 2023 to support operational costs for outbreak response campaigns and technical assistance.

On 5 December 2023, the **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation** and the **French Development Agency** (AFD) announced a <u>new partnership</u> to fund polio eradication efforts and support climate-resilient health systems in Pakistan. This announcement includes a new loan of up to â,¬55 million from AFD to Pakistan, going to support WHOâ€[™]s polio operations in the country.
