Mayor's Grove Clean Up

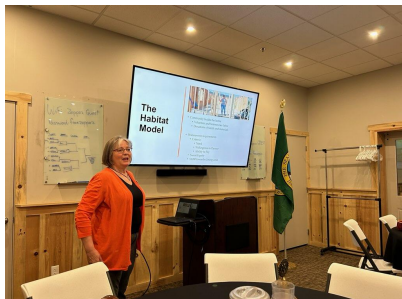
