Jim began the local Richland Rotary Foundation fundraising round by recognizing all members who



were celebrating the anniversary of joining the club. They were C. Mark Smith (2001), Steve Arneson (2002), Andrew Cook (2019) and Bill Crowe III (2022). Jim also sent out best wishes to all members celebrating birthdays this month. All were asked to make the appropriate donation to the foundation.

**Program** 

Grant McCallum introduced Lisa Godwin, director of PCAP, Parent-Child Assistance Program

Lisa described PCAP as an organization that was established in 2005 to provide support services to families seeking recovery from drug addiction. They serve both Benton and Franklin counties. Their goal is to build and maintain healthy, independent, alcohol/drug free lives and prevent future births of alcohol and drug-exposed children.

She shared that our society is suffering a record level of opioid addiction. She also told the members that one in five citizens suffer homelessness. Washington state is number nine in homelessness amongst the 50 states.

PCAP provides a transition to success to affected low income families that have adults in recovery. They provide housing in a three-year program. Their efforts for these families is helping stop the cycle of addiction.

During 2023, PCAP served 21 clients and 200 plus children. They have 10 housing units, 3 rent supports and 5 on the waiting list. They have launched a project to build additional tiny houses.
