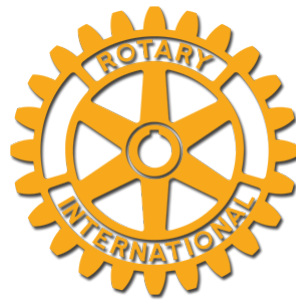

After discussion, it was voted on to move back to the Rec Centre. **Bill Pfeifer** will contact the Rec Centre and find out when we can relocate.

- **Rick** made a motion (seconded by **Scott**) to donate up to \$500 to replace the coffee maker at the Legion. The motion was carried.

- **Pres Gin** thanked **Scott** for covering for her while she was away.

- A motion was made by **Pres Gin** to approve the third Sunday in September (Sept 17th) for Drive For Rotary. **Pres Gin** made the motion and **Gary Teed** seconded it. The motion was approved.
