We currently have 135 registrants with 150 being our max. I do not think we will hit 150 but am pretty sure we will see 140. This will be the biggest ride we have ever hosted and potentially the biggest payday for our club. Last year with 100 riders we made 6 K (u.s.)

1. We will need reception hosts as the riders come into Nelson. I would think we need two teams sharing the time. The riders get spread out and often it is the stragglers who are most in need of direction etc. This job is mainly greeting and directing riders to their hotels where their luggage will have been delivered. We have in the past put up a pop up with signage to be recognized by riders. This should start around 2:00 and run till 4:30 (or so.)
2. This is really important. We need one person to be called upon by the luggage team to help deliver ride luggage to the hotels and campground. Local knowledge and another helping hand really helps, with 140 riders there will be a small mountain of luggage. The ride has rented a 20-foot box van for luggage. Riders will arrive Wednesday September 13th, have a free day the 14th and depart on the 15th. The luggage person is usually called upon around noon on the 13th.
3. It would be really nice to have 3-4 Rotarians join us at the adventure just to mingle. Have a beer and some apples and meet some very interesting people.
4. As I said today our efforts to provide guided hikes etc. has really been under used. Riders take advantage of the bus to Ainsworth (which I will meet) but otherwise are happy to just enjoy Nelson.
5. We need two people to put out road signs and pick them up. One person does Nelson to the Dam In where Castlegar hands off and the other person does Nelson to Balfour. These two will also pick up the signage the next day.
5. Finally I would really like one person to “back me up”.

Adopt a Senior Nelson

Pam Hucal spoke about the Adopt a Senior Nelson program that has been in existence since 2019. The goal of this volunteer group is to provide seniors who live in long-term care or alone, with gifts four or five times throughout the year so they know the community cares. Approximately 100 bags are distributed several times a year to seniors who are low income or live alone. Approximately 48 volunteers are involved with creating the bags and obtaining donations to support the program to provide bags at Christmas, Valentines Day, Easter and Labour Day.
