Things that she learned while in Canada:

Canada has a lot of immigrants, and she learned about diversity. She learned to try anything without fear as well as the importance of making changes in her life. She realizes the convenience and safety of Japan.

How to build relationships, as when she first arrived there were no friends the first day, but she got around the language barrier and made friends. Also, she developed friends from the Church.

Noa gained English skills as the English she learned in Japan is slightly different. She is much more confident now, met a lot of people, at school, Rotary, etc. She traveled with Dave's daughter, Iris, Kwans, Janice and Dave & Cheryl.

She visited Lethbridge, Banff, Calgary, Edmonton, Jasper, Kootenay Lake, Ainsworth Hotsprings and Lake Louise.

She was able to go on a trip to New York, and met a lot of exchange students. She traveled around District 5080 and ended up at the District conference.
