This district-level award recognizes clubs that engage in effective activities for attracting and retaining members. Activities are the emphasis of this award because clubs that regularly employ these activities are usually successful in growing their clubs. We will continue to recognize the top-performing clubs that achieve results in member growth; however, this citation offers the opportunity for any club to earn recognition.

The completed forms should be sent to your DMC <u>dfoxkelsey@hotmail.com</u> no later than April 30, 2022. Simply circle the numbers to the left of the criteria to indicate which activities your club and its members have completed. Then have your

club president and secretary sign and date.

If your club is very small and does not have a designated membership chair, please indicate which club officer (e.g., secretary) has responsibility for this function at the bottom of the citation form or in a separate document. Please note that club members can be assigned multiple roles in DACdb and My Rotary, and these assignments can still be made. This assignment will be required for next year's citation. If you don't have a My Rotary account, please follow these instructions: <u>My Rotary</u>

One of the required activities for earning the citation is setting your club's membership goal in Rotary Club Central (RCC). You can navigate to RCC from My Rotary by clicking on "Member Center", then "Online Tools", then "Rotary Club Central." The number you enter for your goal represents the total number of members your club seeks to have enrolled by June 30.

Several of the activities involve the completion of Learning Center modules. To locate the Learning Center modules from My Rotary, click on "Member Center", then "Online Tools", then "Learning Center." This takes you to the "Courses by Topic" section where you will find the designated courses as listed on the citation:

Other listed activities involve club exercises and assessments that can be located in the Membership Materials section of My Rotary. These can be accessed from My Rotary by clicking on "Member Center"

District and Global Grants Available to Rotact Clubs in the 2022-2023 Rotary Year

Beginning in July 2022, Rotaract clubs will be eligible to receive Rotary Foundation <u>District grant</u> funds or <u>Global grants</u> to support their service efforts in their own communities and abroad. Districts can now include Rotaract Clubs in their 2022-23 district grant spending plans. And in July, Rotaract clubs can apply for Global Rotary grants.

Literacy and access to education have increased around the world.

In 1870, only one in four people in the world attended school, and this meant that only one in five were able to read. Global inequalities in access to education were very large. Today, in contrast, the global estimates of literacy and school attendance are above 80%, and the inequality between world regions – while still existing – is much lower.

A short two centuries ago, only a small elite of the world population had the ability to read and write – the best estimate is that 12% of the world population was literate. Over the course of the 19th century, global literacy more than doubled. And over the course of the 20th century, the world achieved rapid progress in education. More than 4 out of 5 people are now able to read. Young generations are better educated than ever before. Read More

An emergency grant was submitted to assist the school in rebuilding and resupply the students impacted by this disaster.
