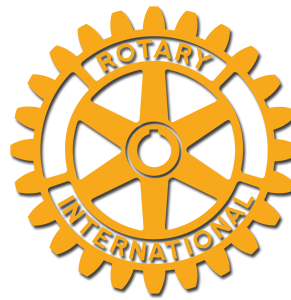

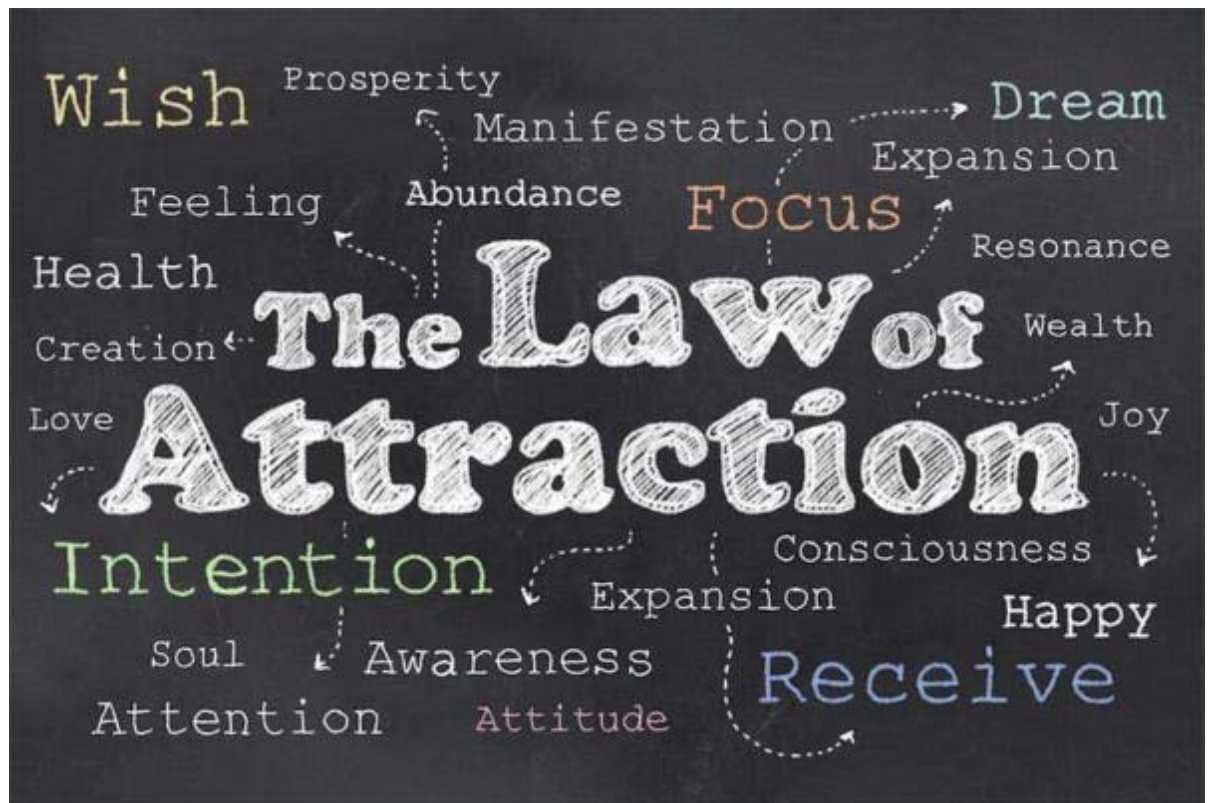

District Express Grants Deadline

There is currently US\$ 6,800 remaining in the 2021-2022 Express Grant Fund. This is equivalent to 17 Express Grants. To ensure all the funds allocated for this purpose are distributed before the end of the fiscal year, an **application deadline of March 15th** has been established. Any application submitted after this date will be denied, and the funds will be reallocated for use in a Pan-District Grant.

Membership Committee Roles and Expectations

For Members at Large

1. Attend training sessions as suggested by the membership chair and assistant governor
2. Review membership statistics and reports as distributed – some are weekly; most are monthly or less frequently
3. Assist clubs in your AG area with correct disposition of member leads
4. Assist clubs in recruiting and retaining members
 - a. Share techniques we learn from training and from each other
 - b. Inform clubs of their opportunities (e.g., Rotaractors can be both Rotarians and Rotaractors)
 - c. Inform clubs of their options in terms of meeting flexibility and different types of membership (e.g., family, corporate, etc.)
 - d. Inform clubs of their options in terms of club types (e.g., Passport, E-Club, etc.)
 - e. Promote opportunities for membership engagement (e.g., Rotary Fellowships, Rotary Action Groups, leadership development, and service beyond club)
5. Identify opportunities for the chartering of new clubs
6. Report monthly to the membership chair regarding your successes and challenges (this can be informal – it does not have to be a written report – a phone call, text or email is sufficient)

For New Clubs Initiative Leader

1. Identify opportunities for chartering new clubs
 - a. Make referrals to membership chair
 - b. Advise membership chair of demographic and cultural characteristics unique to each community
 - c. Partner with membership chair with outreach to new club champions (new club champions are sometimes members of existing clubs who see opportunities for expansion in new clubs or these can be prospective Rotarians who want to start a club in their community or within their social group, such as Toastmasters)
2. Assist in recruiting prospective members
3. Assist in organizing informational meetings (can be virtual or in-person, depending on circumstances)
4. Attend meetings convened by Zone Leadership that support the New Clubs Initiative (these are infrequent – mostly involve pro-actively reaching out to Zone coordinators and responding to them with progress updates)
5. Attend training as recommended by the membership chair (these are virtual and at your discretion)
