
District 5080 is a Global Peacebuilder District!



International Day of Peace - 21 September 2024



This year marks the 25th anniversary of the United Nations General Assembly's adoption of the <u>Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace</u>.

In that declaration, the United Nations' most inclusive body recognized that peace

"not only is the absence of conflict, but also requires a positive, dynamic participatory process where dialogue is encouraged and conflicts are solved in a spirit of mutual understanding and cooperation.†The Constitution of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) starts with the notion that "wars begin in the minds of men so it is in the minds of men that the defences of peace must be constructedâ€. It is this notion that framed the theme and logo of this year's observance of the International Day of Peace. The ideas of peace, the culture of peace, need to be cultivated in the minds of children and communities through formal and informal education, across countries and generations.

The International Day of Peace has always been a time to lay down weapons and observe ceasefires. But it now must also be a time for people to see each other $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}^m$ s humanity. Our survival as a global community depends on that.

"Sea levels are rising at a rate not seen in at least 3,000 years. If we don't reverse these climate change trends, we will see this tragedy in other coastal areas globally.â€

<u>United Nations</u> Secretary-General <u>@antonio-guterres</u> has issued a stark warning during his visit to Pacific island nations.

"The world can no longer wait to take bold and resolute international climate action,†he stressed during his visit to Samoa, highlighting that high and rising sea levels are already causing severe damage and disrupting people's lives in coastal communities in the Pacific region and other places around the world.
