I want to share some exciting news about Orchards Park and the Rose Garden. As you all know, our club has a long history with Orchards Park, starting back in 1986. What started as one work day just to remove overgrown brush from an undeveloped section



of the park that had become unsafe, has grown to become one of our club's signature projects. We continued to remove brush, built the picnic shelter, and put in the Rose Garden to honor our Clark County Hall of Fame honorees. We have continued to maintain the Rose Garden, but in the last few years have been wondering how we might make improvements that would be lasting and fit in with the park in general.

I recently spoke to a parks person to reserve the picnic shelter for our Presidents Dinner on June 21st. In our conversation she wanted to make sure that I knew the shelter had no power or water. I assured her that I was aware of that because we had built it. Our conversation continued and I asked a few more questions about plans for the park and picnic shelter and she had one of the county parks planners contact me.

Apparently, they are in the process of applying for a grant to make many improvements at Orchards Park. I expressed an interest in being in the loop on the progress and mentioned that we might be interested in doing some upgrades at the Rose Garden as part of the process. She was thrilled and hopes to be able to incorporate the Rose Garden into the plans and to provide some suggestions from their designer on what we might want to do that would dovetail into the other upgrades.


