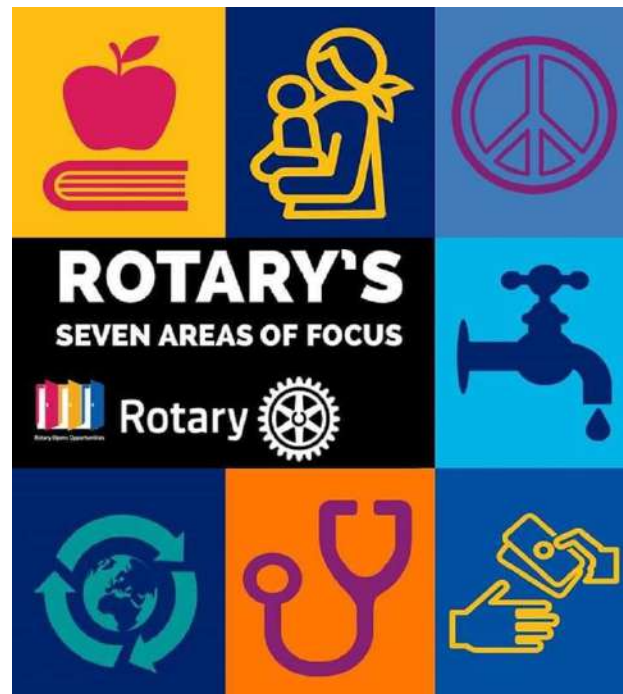

GLOBAL GRANTS

Advantages:

- Leverage – Matching funds
 - District and Rotary International
- Safeguards to ensure project success.
 - Community Assessment
 - Sustainability
 - Monitoring

Disadvantages:

- Restrictions on what the project can fund.
 - No Construction.
 - Scholarships
 - Only Graduate and post-graduate
- Much more planning and follow-up
- Slower to complete.

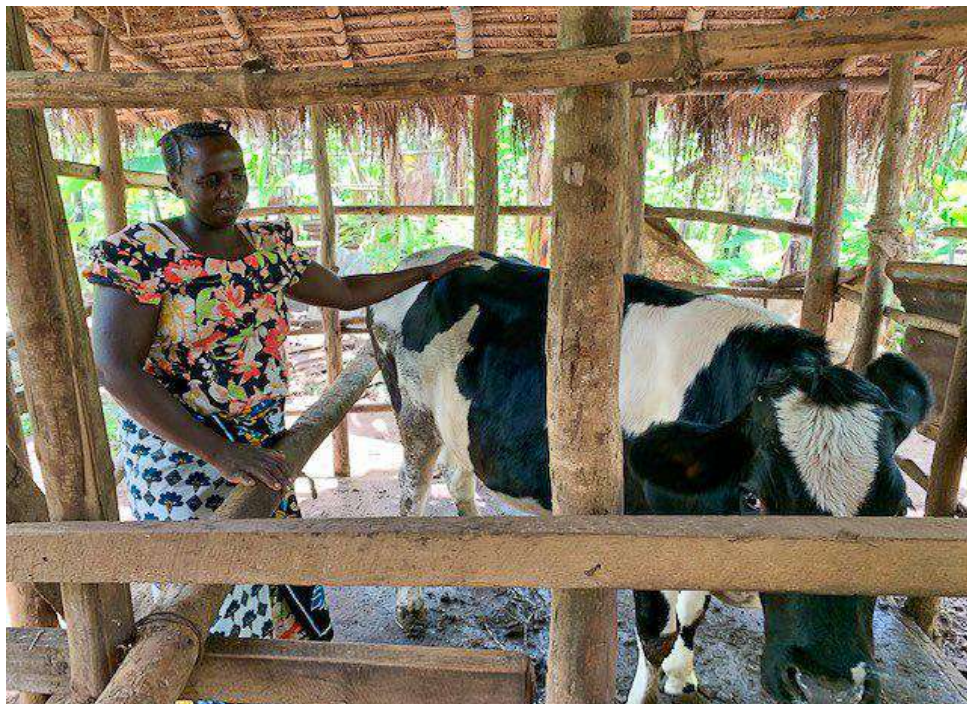

Single grant awarded annually



DISTRICT GRANTS

Advantages:

- Faster
- Fewer restrictions
 - Construction allowed
 - Scholarships allowed
- Easier application process
- Managed by District
- No max. or minimum cost
- Partnership not required
- Sustainability not required
- Measurability not required

Disadvantages:

- Limited Leverage
 - Only District Matching funds
- Less safeguards



NON-MATCHING GRANTS

Local or International Activities

Advantages:

- Fast
- Easy - Less red tape
- Minimal Requirements
- Minimal restrictions
- No max. or minimum cost
- Partnership not required
- Sustainability not required
- Measurability not required

Disadvantages:

- No Leverage - No Matching funds
- Less safeguards

The Girl Effect

The girl effect is a movement.
It's about leveraging the unique
potential of adolescent girls to end
poverty for themselves, their families,
their communities, their countries and
the world.

THE GIRL EFFECT STATISTICS

- Approximately 12 million girls aged 15–19 years and at least 777,000 girls under 15 years give birth each year in developing regions.
- Complications during pregnancy and childbirth are the leading cause of death for 15–19-year-old girls globally.
- When a girl in the developing world receives seven or more years of education, she marries four years later and has 2.2 fewer children.
- An extra year of primary school boosts girls' eventual wages by 10 to 20 %. An extra year of secondary school: 15 to 25 %.
- When women and girls earn income, they reinvest 90 % of it into the health, nutrition and educational needs of their families
(as compared to only 30 to 40 % for men).

Only **10%** of indigenous girls graduate from
high school, and about **1%** continue on to
university.

By age 20, over **50%** of indigenous girls
have become mothers.

Guatemala ranks **118** out of **134** countries
in women's political participation.

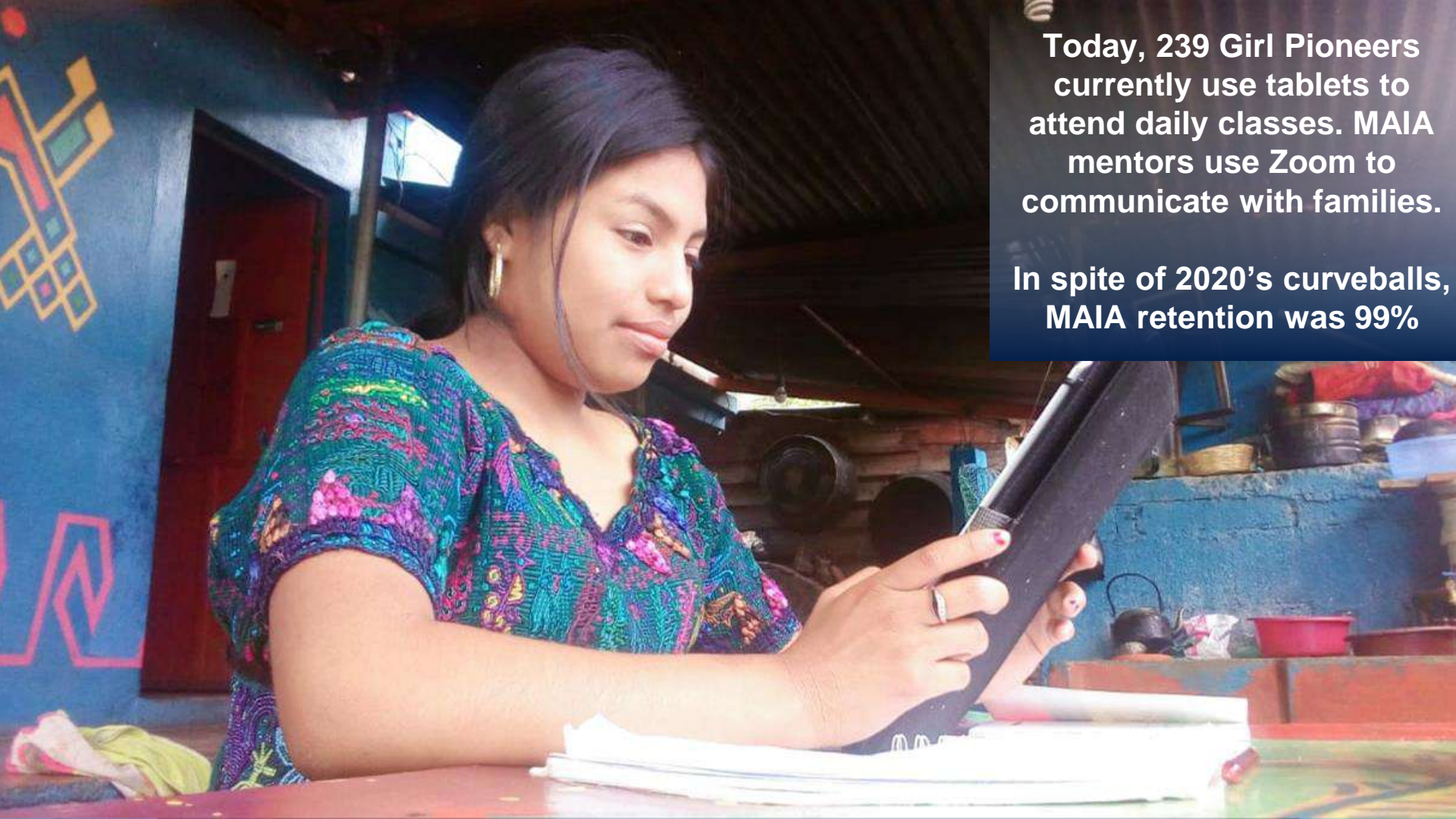
