Scott Havens Past LO Rotary President

Our past President, Scott Havens, went to OSU for Business Marketing.

He graduated from OSU in 1976 and started working for his father. After college, he began selling products in every island in the Pacific past Hawaii, including bora bora, Tahiti, Marshall Islands, Saipan, Guam, Palau, Pago Pago, Fiji, New Zealand and many others.



Scott's father was an LO Rotarian from the late 70's through the 80's. His father lived in Japan after WW2 and had started the import export business. They started selling lumber at first and then diversified into overhead power, steel buildings, military construction products.

After his father passed away, Scott sold the business to Ferguson (Familian NW) and worked for the new owners for 17 years, leading the international business unit. The company is a big plumbing company constructing waterworks and underground piping systems.

Mark Waller reported that the Bikes 4 Kids program collected 630 bikes!

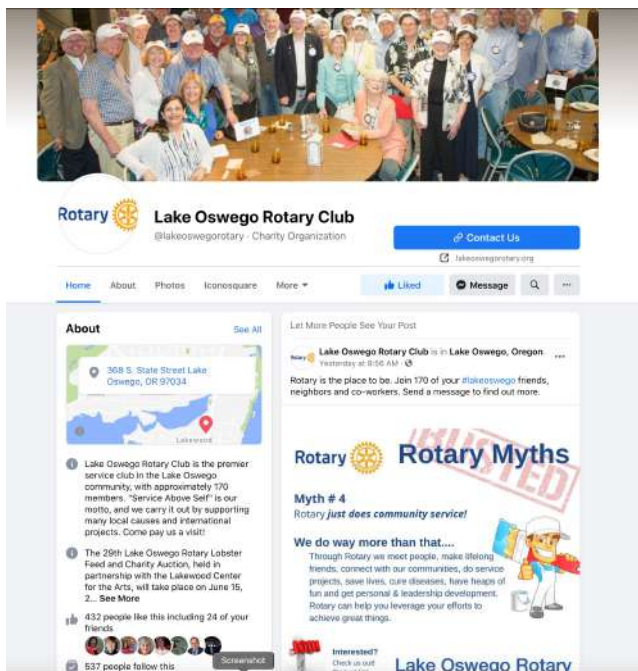
Volunteer sessions for Tuesdays, Thursday and Saturday afternoons are organized for working on the bikes to fix them up and clean them before distributing.

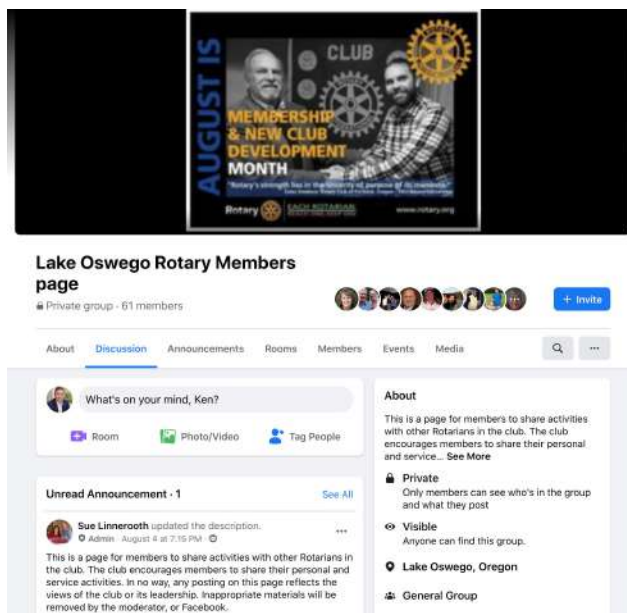

Featured Speakers

Harold Linke Sculptor LinkeSculptor.com



Harold has been an LO Rotary member since March 2021. He became a professional sculptor 30 years ago and has produced over 1,000 sculptures, including one that has been featured in Lake Oswego.

Harold earned 3 degrees in engineering from Stanford. For a number of years, he owned the largest engineering firm in Utah. His wife, Deborah, is an important person in the hydro-power industry.

After he sold his engineering firm, Harold and Deborah moved to Evergreen, Colorado. They have 2 children, 2 foster children and 7 grandchildren.

Two years ago, his daughter and son-in-law were recruited into executive positions in the hydro-power in Portland. This is what led the whole family to Oregon.

Harold's artistic process is to pass reality through him into the 3-D space

He studied artistic anatomy for 3 years to learn how to truly capture the fluid structures of the models he creates. He has also been part of an artistic group for 20 years that has helped him improve over the years.

His process starts with envisioning a person and then a setting. He takes the vision and uses 3-D modeling to develop a model on a computer. From this he refines his sculpture and decides on the materials. Many of his sculptures are made of carbon fiber because it is a light weight but strong material that helps make the sculpture appear more graceful than other materials would.

Harold was approached by Ice Skater Peggy Fleming (Olympic Gold Medalist) to produce a sculpture for her for an ice-skating rink in Colorado. He has also made sculptures to celebrate drama at the Performing arts Center in Silverthorne, CO and many more

Harold currently lives on G avenue where he has made his studio, and if you walk by and the studio door is open, he invites anyone to come in and look around.
