

Vocation Services Month is January. Bill also discussed how their goal is to bring in one speaker per year and have open houses.


Habitat for Humanity in Beaverton and Lake Oswego have merged. The goal will be to build 100 homes in 2021.



Brian Monihan

Brian Monahan was our guest speaker. Brian and his wife have 5 children. He is a former Rotarian who used to write the He discussed how he used to save all his photos and how he even had some embarrassing photos on some our members. He discussed how the media landscape has changed when it used to be TV, Radio, and Newspaper while now we have Social Media like Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, YouTube and others. Advertising dollars are all now being spread between the Newspapers and Social Media Platforms. One of the challenges with Social Media is many stories are not validated. Currently there are 3 major newspapers – The New York Times, USA Today and Wall Street Journal. Currently there are over 6500 community newspapers and the number are dropping. There is a strong correlation between more accountability and less corruption when local newspapers help in the role of being a watchdog. He gave an example of a case in West Linn that his newspaper brought to the readers several years ago long before it became national news.
